Wetheringsett Wildlife

We are fortunate to have Mickfield Meadow on our doorstep. Mickfield Meadow became Suffolk's first nature reserve in 1923. It is noted for goldilocks buttercups, ragged robin, wood anemones but most especially snake's head fritillary.

I first visited the meadow about 20 years ago and have to admit I was a little disappointed in the display of fritillaries that year. Whilst there I met two ladies who had lived in the village all their lives and they said that when they were children



there were far more fritillaries to enjoy. However, last year the display was simply stunning. The whole place was awash with purple blooms with a splash of white ones too.

As I write this (22<sup>nd</sup> April) I have been told that the fritillaries are currently in bud so by the time you read this the display should be in its full glory. With the sun now shining and the temperature rising grab a sandwich and a bottle of water and take an afternoon walk down to see for yourself!

# What is the Neighbourhood Plan?

The Wetheringsett-cum-Brockford Neighbourhood Plan is a planning policy document written by the community to guide future development in the area over the next 20 years. It covers the whole parish. If successful at referendum, the Neighbourhood Plan will become part of the statutory development plan for the area. It will be used to determine planning applications.



# Who is involved?

A Steering Group has been commissioned by the Parish Council, involving Parish Councillors and local residents. The group are involved in listening to the community to form the content of the Plan.

# Middy says, "We're getting there", Sponsor-a-Sleeper to help complete the line to Aspall Halt.

During the various stages of the Covid 19 restrictions, the Mid-suffolk Light Railway have still been able to make significant progress on their main project of extending the line.

The first major advance was the preparation and tidying around the Dovebrook platform, which also included the building of a new footbridge to access both the station and picnic areas. This work was carried out by the Middy Infrastructure Team.

On March 1st TES2000 Network Rail Contractors carried out more heavy lifting for the MSLR beyond Dovebrook taking the line to the beginning of the climb to the final destination.

The TES eight man team extended the track some 73 metres closer to the long held aim of adding a further 500 metres to the track length. The work also included crossing the divide caused by the public footpath and installing a new public foot crossing. A 360 degree road/rail digger was employed with the Middy's own works train in support.

This is the first time that the track has been extended for 15 years.

The new section follows the existing track bed and when completed, will enhance the visitor experience of this unique Edwardian Railway by more than doubling the length of demonstration journey and giving passengers a 'destination', Aspall Halt, where the line will terminate. The construction is being modelled on the old station at Wilby, which had the minimal building and facilities so typical of the cash-strapped Middy.

The MSLR is now renewing its campaign to fund the rest of the track work and the platform at the end of the line - the railway already has the station building - a recovered original MSLR building from the old station at Haughley.

The Mid Suffolk Light Railway season opens on 30<sup>th</sup> and 31st with 'Middy in the War Years' featuring period military vehicles, displays, re-enactments and two locos in steam on passenger and demonstration duties. The opening programme then continues every Sunday and Bank Holiday from 6th June to 5th September

# Hedgehogs

How many hedgehogs have you observed in recent years? They can be spotted in Wetheringsett and there is certainly evidence they wander around locally, but sadly, their numbers have fallen dramatically with the loss of habitat. In the past decade, we have lost over half of rural hedgehogs and a third from towns and cities. They have now been added to the Red List for British Mammals as 'vulnerable to extinction'. It would be devastating to lose them.

With the arrival of Spring, the natural world awakens from it's slumbers and with it, hedgehogs. They are true hibernators as they enter a state of torpor

rather than sleep, dropping their temperatures to match their surroundings. With the fluctuating temperatures this year, they are probably as confused as we are! They hibernate from October/ November until March/April. Any disturbance during this time can use up precious energy reserves.

Widely seen as allies in the garden, their diet is made up of inver-

tebrates such as slugs, leatherjackets, worms and earwigs etc.

Positive steps can be taken by everyone to restore a 'hog friendly' environment. We know that the secure fencing of our modern gardens reduces the roaming capabilities (this can be anything up to a mile a night in their quest for food and a mate), but we can encourage their movement by cutting a small hole in the garden fence through which they can travel, making a hedgehog highway! They thrive where there are well managed mosaics of hedges, fields, and woodlands. If our own gardens are chemical (and slug pellet) free and if we leave a wild area with wood piles and rough cover, we offer the ideal spot for them to feel at home. Avoid disturbing piles of wood and certainly if you pile your garden cuttings and prunings for a bonfire in Autumn, always check before lighting, hedgehogs are attracted to this seemingly inviting pile!

# South Hartismere Benefice

May New sletter 2021



One of the good things to come out of lockdown has been an increasing interest in the world around us, and a healing of our environments as a result of the reduction in human activity – rivers running clear again, more birds returning to our gardens, and seeing more wildlife in their natural habitats. Although we were advised to stay home for large

parts of the past year, we were encouraged to take some exercise. Walking around our beautiful country lanes and pathways has become an important way of life, and new friendships have been made as we have passed one another on our daily walk. People have been taking amazing photographs of birds, wildlife, flowers and the weather and sharing them on Facebook. Some of these will be on view in our 'Lockdown Through the Seasons' Exhibition in September – details to follow!

Our rural churches are committed to caring for the environment and reducing the effects of climate change. Our churchyards all have wildlife areas where the grass is left untended to allow for wild flowers, bees and butterflies to flourish, and in Spring they are carpeted with snowdrops, primroses and violets. Three of our churches are **Eco Churches**, with a special focus on caring for creation, caring for the poor and vulnerable, and building community relationships so that all people can access and appreciate nature.

Teaching about care for creation in church, and acting on it, helps our life and faith become more relevant to the world around us. Through Eco church we are encouraged to make lifestyle choices: buying fairly-traded and ecofriendly goods, recycling, being energy efficient and reducing our carbon footprint. Care for the environment is a focus for younger people in particular, and our **CONNECT Outdoor church** encourages native wildlife in our churchyards through the provision of bird and bat boxes, bug hotels, hedgehog homes, bird feeders, bird tables and bird baths. In partnership with our local schools we are introducing **Inspired Classrooms**, which uses the church building and grounds as a learning resource for all subjects, including sketching and imagining, shapes and patterns, counting, and being an architectural investigator.

If you are out and about this month, take a wander through your local churchyard and appreciate the beauty of creation! In June we will be celebrating mid-summer with a **Hedgerow Festival** in some of our churches – so watch this space!

### Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on the virtual meeting held Tuesday 6 April 2021

<u>Annual Parish Meeting</u> – this will be held Tuesday 4 May 2021 at 7pm. It will be a video meeting due to covid restrictions but will be open to parishioners who will be able to take part during the public session. The Annual Parish Meeting was cancelled last May due to lockdown so this will be an ideal opportunity for parishioners to comment on any issues relating to the village. The video link will be available on the meeting agenda published at the end of April.

The Annual Parish Council Meeting will follow the above and will be open to the public via video link.

<u>Hedge – Station Road</u> – some concerns had been raised by parishioners over the coppicing of the hedge to the ground level. It was reported this had been carried out due to complaints of the hedge encroaching on to the highway making it difficult for vehicles to pass in places. Coppicing it to ground level would enable the hedge to be managed as it re-grows.

<u>Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras</u> – due to some of the high speeds recorded in the village by the VAS equipment, parish council members have agreed to take part in a pilot scheme being funded by Suffolk CC in partnership with Suffolk Constabulary to tackle speeding hot spots across the county. The cameras will be used to help detect and deter speeding in towns and villages and to educate drivers on the importance of road safety. An ANPR camera will be installed at a site identified as a hot spot on roads with a 20 or 30mph restriction. The devices will be moved between sites and remain in situ for up to one week per site. Data collected will be shared with the Police and County Council. Owners of vehicles caught speeding will receive a letter notifying them of any excess speed. Repeat offences could prompt deployment of a SafeCam and issuing of fines to those who breach the speed limit.

<u>Neighbourhood Plan (NP)</u> – a progress report was given to the meeting by the Chairman of the Working Group, Mr Robert Townshend, and the NP consultant Andrea Long. It is important that parishioners take part in surveys during the different stages as the Plan is developed – please view the NP website at wetheringsettcumbrockford.onesuffolk.net





# Snippets from the Village History: Foundation of the School

The following extract from the Trust Deed explains the conditions under which the school was founded.

Rev. John Parkinson, under 5th and 8th years of reign of her Majesty, piece of land \*one rood and 32 perches, land called Gibbs Pightle numbered 12 on map. Education for adults or children of the labouring, manufacturing and other poorer classes of the parish of Wetheringsett cum Brockford AND FOR NO OTHER PURPOSE always to be open for inspection dated 10.8.1840 for furtherance of the aims and designs of the National Society, principal officiating minister shall have superintendance of the religious instruction and moral for scholars and may use or direct premises to be used, for Sunday School ....parson had authority for appointment and dismissal of staff, the parson or curate. churchwarden and eight other persons formed a committee, could also appoint or dismiss under direction of Bishop of diocese. Eight were Robert Eden Moore, James George Sheppard of Campsea Ash. Robert Woodward of Akenham, George Hayward of Brames Hall, Henry Woodward of Wetheringsett, Samuel Peck of Eye, Frederick Haywood of Needham Market, Henry Weavers of Wetheringsett all to contribute 20 shillings at the least to the funds of the said school and be members of the C. of E. And to have real estate in the parish or adjoining. New members elected to the committee during the year had to subscribe 10 shillings per vote. All members of the committee had to sign in a book the following declaration : 'I A B do hereby sincerely and solemnly declare that I am a member of the United Church of England and Ireland as by law. Established ...




