



A Celebration of Nature

Swifts

'It is on the wing that she takes her repose, Suspended and poised in the regions of air; 'Tis not in our fields that her sustenance grows, It is winged like herself-'tis ethereal fare.'



This verse was originally written about swallows, gathering insects in the sky, just as swifts do. Distinguished from swallows by their colouring and sound; swifts make an unmistakable piercing, high pitched 'scream' and are dark sooty brown all over. Swallows 'twitter', have a red throat and white underside, with a bluish sheen on the head and back.

We have a cluster of swifts who visit us year on year and are seen around Wetheringsett church. May is the normal month of their arrival having overwintered in Africa, travelling via France and Spain. They need warm weather to provide a constant supply of flying insects, which is another reason for us all to support biodiversity where we increase the numbers of insects in our gardens and avoid sprays to encourage a balance of insects.

Swifts start their return journey in mid July, before nights become too cool, much sooner than Swallows who gather on the wires in September on average.

How long do swifts live? Up to 21 years! So one individual may fly more than one million kilometres during its lifetime.

When you hear that tell-tale 'screech', you know Summer has arrived.



## Bats in Churches

#### CHURCH OF ENGLAND ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMME

An in-depth bat survey is taking place this spring/summer at All Saints Church as a step towards possibly reducing the impact of the bats on the fabric and use of the church without affecting the conservation of the bats.

The first survey was on 20<sup>th</sup> May, a second planned for 16<sup>th</sup> June and a third on 21<sup>st</sup> July. So, if you are passing on one of those evenings, and see people in the churchyard, you will know why they are there.

The surveys are led by a licenced ecologist who, with a team, will be

very busy counting the bats and the species as they emerge at dusk.



We are hoping to hold a bat walk in September (date to be decided) for anyone who is interested in the bats. We know from a previous survey that there is a large colony of Soprano Pipistrelles and some Long-Eared Bats too.

#### Bat Facts

- \* There are eighteen species of bat in Britain and all are protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act.
- \* Bats are the only mammals capable of controlled flight
- \* The most common bat seen in Britain is also the smallest of our 18 species and it is known as the **pipistrelle**.
- \* Average life span of a pipistrelle is 4-5 years.
- \* You can attract bats into your garden by growing strongly-scented flowering plants, such as honeysuckle, sweet briar and white jasmine. These will attract insects, which in turn attract bats.





Did you Know .....

Very pleased to announce that the Mid-Suffolk Light Railway has won this years HRA Morgan Preservation award for the restoration and return to traffic of the original Shredded Wheat factory shunter, immediately dubbed 'Shreddie' by all involved.

This amazing project, returning a rusting hulk which hadn't turned a wheel in 15 years back to working order, was carried out by two Middy volunteers, Neal and Nigel Davis with the enthusiastic support of the loco's owner Tony Goff in just 6 months.

#### Middy and Shreddie scoop the HRA Preservation Award

The Heritage Railway Association prestigious Morgan Preservation Award has been won by the Mid-Suffolk Light Railway, and their restored Shredded Wheat diesel mechanical locomotive at a virtual event on 28th April.

The 1934 0-4-0 locomotive was built for the Shredded Wheat Company's Welwyn Garden City factory by Fowler of Leeds. Years after falling out use it was eventually bought at auction in a completely derelict state by Mr. Tony Goff, who offered it to the MSLR, but it was seized solid and immovable, so the Middy couldn't take immediately. However, Tony then contacted brothers Neal and Nigel Davis about restoration at their works near Attleborough in Norfolk.

Neal and Nigel, who are both members and volunteers at the Mid-Suffolk Light Railway and, by general consent, in charge of the Middy's diesel fleet due to their enthusiasm and expertise for all things internal combustion, set to, to return the rusting hulk into working locomotive again.

After only 6 months work and the support of owner Tony, 'Shreddie' was delivered in full working order to the Brockford headquarters of the Middy, where it has remained ever since as a valued member of the railway's motive power complement. It is now usually to be found heading the works train whenever help is need on track or trackside maintenance and, more recently, engaged on the MSLR extension project to double the length of the line. 'Shreddie' has also now been fitted with vacuum brakes and can be used on passenger trains, although as Neal commented, 'It is so low geared it might be quicker to walk!'

Owner Tony is absolutely delighted that his engine has become an award winner, but quick to give credit to the Middy team for their skill and the opportunity for proper work the railway provides for 'Shreddie'.



### Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on the Annual Parish Council meeting held 4 May 2021

<u>Chairman</u> – Cllr Mrs Liz Cain was elected to stand as Chairman for the forth-coming year and Cllr Mrs Ann Arnold was elected Vice Chairman. Thanks were recorded to Liz and Ann for taking on these roles and thanks were recorded to Cllr Charles Harvey for his chairmanship over the last two years, this had been much appreciated particularly during the last challenging year when meetings had been conducted via video link.

The Government has deemed that with effect from 7 May 2021 parish and town councils can no longer meet remotely and with effect from 17 May must return to live meetings. ## Snippets from the Village History: Foundation of the School

Whites Directory records that a Parochial School was built in 1859 by subscription, for 100 children, partly by voluntary subscriptions partly by rents of parish property. There was to be Government Inspection. The National Society was mentioned in the Trust Deed. The records they have are scanty but are recorded as follows:

In September 1859 the society was advised by the rector J P Sill that it was proposed to build a school-room 45½ft by 18ft with a classroom 18ft by 12ft to accommodate 80 children, also a six-roomed teacher's residence.

The site consisted of half an acre of glebe valued at £15 had been granted by the rector and was to be conveyed to the rector and churchwardens as trustees. It was estimated that the cost would amount to £340 for the schoolroom plus £150 for fittings with a further £250 for the residence and £40+ for expenses.

There were apparently in existence two dames schools connected with the church also a Sunday school. The former were to be continued as preparatory schools and the Sunday school as before.

About £380 had been raised by local effort plus the promise of free cartage of materials to a probable value of £112. Unfortunately the Society was unable to hold out much hope of assistance because of the very low state of its finances.

An application for grant was made to the Education Department and £309.3s was voted. This was a mixed blessing, however, as Mr Sill wrote that the requirements which were a condition of the grant had added considerably to the cost of the undertaking.

The buildings were completed by the end of April 1860 and opening deferred only until a suitable master could be found.

The final cost amounted to £805.2.8d excluding the value of the site and the free cartage. A deficiency of £115 in the funds was paid by the rector and two others. The Society agreed to make a small contribution of £20 towards the deficit and the Diocese also agreed to contribute, but we do not know to what extent.
