
Morrisons Good to grow vouchers



Advice to parishioners Increase in parish precept for 2022/23

As you will all be aware, during the last few months major renovations have been undertaken to make the village hall fit for future use.

Thanks to an anonymous donor the south wall has been completely rebuilt. All windows in the main section of the building are to be replaced. (The replacement of the south side windows has been delayed by Covid but will be undertaken soon.)

We have received a grant for the replacement of some outdated heaters and these will be replaced very soon, hopefully prior to publication of the newsletter.

Our donor has paid for the rebuilding of the south wall, and the windows and new bifold doors have been paid for by both the village hall committee and the parish council.

However during the demolition of the south wall the builders realised that the entire floor in the main body of the hall, and the recovery room at the rear, was completely rotten and had to be urgently replaced in order to allow them to rebuild the wall.

Additionally, once the bi-fold doors were installed, the building inspector advised that building regulations required the construction of a patio outside the bi-fold door area. Both these items were not only unexpected, and of course urgent, but neither the village hall committee nor the parish council had sufficient funds to meet this expenditure.

After discussion it was suggested that we approach the Town Estate Charity to ask if they could loan the parish council the funds, to be repaid over a period of time. The Town Estate Charity has kindly agreed to loan the parish council the funds to pay for the floor replacement and the patio, but of course these funds have to be repaid. We now wish to advise you that in order to repay the loan we will need to increase the parish precept for 2022/23. The precept will increase by 11% going forward which

This will be the first increase in precept for 3 years and we hope you will agree that it represents a very worthwhile investment in the village hall.

The hall is the main asset of the village and is used daily by the school and is of course available at a very small charge to all villagers for your own personal events.

This will now be a pleasant experience for children and villagers alike, rather than one pervaded by the smell of damp and rot!

We wanted to advise you in advance of the increase in precept.

represents a total amount of £980 for the coming year.

If you have any comments please do not hesitate to contact the parish clerk. Her contact details are in the newsletter.

We would like to record here our thanks both to our anonymous donor and to the Town Estate Charity. Without them we would not now have what is to all intents and purposes a "new" village hall.

We are extremely grateful.

Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on the meeting held Monday 10th January at the Village Hall

The Chair welcomed members, parishioners and County and District Cllr Andrew Stringer to the first meeting of the New Year.

<u>Village Hall</u> – refurbishment work has continued on the Hall by the Village Hall Committee assisted by parish councillors and District & County Cllr Andrew Stringer. The end result will be a completely refurbished hall for the benefit of the community and huge thanks were recorded to all involved in the work and funding.

Please see the separate report in the magazine from the Parish Council Chair and Chair of the VH. Please contact the clerk with your comments.

<u>Planning Applications</u> – three planning applications were considered for recommendation to MSDC Planning:

DC/21/03140 - Clay Cottage, Pitman's Corner – re-consultation for change of use of domestic outbuilding to workshop. Having considered the additional documentation provided by Mid Suffolk Planning, Parish Councillors reiterated their recommendation of support for this application.

DC/21/06866 - Green Farm, Pages Green – demolition of existing agricultural buildings and erection of 2 new residential units. Parish Councillors recommended refusal of this application on the grounds the proposal appeared to encroach into agricultural land and members believed there was a need for smaller family units rather than the two proposed executive dwellings.

DC/21/06605 – Land to rear of Ceva Logistics, Norwich Road – erection of 3 warehouse units, external storage and new access – Parish Councillors recommended refusal of this application on the grounds the proposal included an additional access directly on to a busy section of the A140 when it appeared the proposal could use the existing access.

Full details of the above can be viewed on the MSDC Planning Website.

Neighbourhood Plan – Mr Robert Townshend, Chairman of the Working
Group, attended the meeting to give a progress report. The very first draft
has been prepared. The Plan will provide the first ever community—led
statutory planning policy document specificially for the village, a document
for guiding the future of the village. The Chair thanked Mr Townshend
attending and thanks were recording to the Working Group for all their work
so far.

Date of next meeting: Monday 7 February 2022, 7pm at the Village Hall. Meeting Open to the Public – Parishioners are encouraged to take part during the Open Session.

A Celebration of Nature Snowdrops

In February, we welcome the wonderful sight of drifts of snowdrops. According to the language of flowers, the snowdrop is the symbol of hope and consolation,

which is rather apt at this time of year, particularly as we enter a further year of resisting the pandemic and also, environmental concerns. The green shoots of these flowers are the first to pierce the snow in late Winter, and they signal new life every spring.

Wetheringsett churchyard and the public footpath beside it offers a lovely display. Already, the shoots are up.



The flower is known as a 'drop' of snow in English, as is the case in many languages, a term believed to be derived from the German *Schneetropfen*, after the teardrop-shaped pearl earrings popular in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. There are other common English names and 'Candlemas Bells' is a favourite, along with 'Fair Maids of February'. The French have a name that represents how the shoots pierce the snow: 'peirce-neige'.

In Britain, there are snowdrop enthusiasts called 'galanthophiles', a word taken from the Latin, Galanthus. This 'obsession' began when soldiers returning from the Crimean War brought back bulbs of *Galanthus.plicatus*. Realising there was more to snowdrops than the common *G. nivalis*, nurserymen and, as importantly, amateur growers began collecting.

Although the days can seem endlessly dark at this time of year, a walk amongst the bright drifts of snowdrops that are a feature of many East Anglian gardens will certainly be that symbol of 'hope and consolation' we all need.



National Trust properties have many walks where you can enjoy the snowdrops in early Spring. One of the most spectacular & well known is Anglesey Abbey, with as many as 350 varieties growing.

Ickworth also has gardens where snowdrops flower alongside the other early bloom, the aconite. Further north, the gardens of Walsingham Abbey are carpeted with these beautiful flowers.


We would hope that this will take place on the afternoon of June 3rd, which is a Bank Holiday.

Snippets from the Village History

This report from the Village History is pertinent to recent experiences as it tells of the school being closed due illness epidemics!

Sickness ~ Dental and Medical Inspection

There were many long spells when the school was closed because of scarlet fever, whooping cough, influenza, chicken pox and measles epidemics. The Hartismere Deanery Magazine records that the school was closed for 3 months due to measles:

January 1905:

The Day School was reopened on January 16th, and as it has been closed for three months for measles, it is hoped that parents will do their utmost to send their children to school regularly and that no more valuable time may be lost.

Children had to suspended if they had been in contact with any of the infectious diseases. One case of water pox was recorded. In 1894 Mrs Moore from the Manor distributed cough mixture and cough sweets as the school had an epidemic of coughs and colds.

It is interesting to record that there were quite a number of deaths among the young children, these being mainly from pneumonia and one dead from tetanus. There are also records of young children staying at home during the winter months as they were "too frail" to attend school.

The first record of a dental officer visiting the school appears in 1921 and the the first doctor's visit was in September 1924. In 1927 the first eye inspection was made. At this time the school nurse began her visits.





I've been living in my privately rented flat for years. I generally have a good relationship with my landlord but I just can't get them to carry out various repairs that have built up. How can I get them to act - and what exactly do they have to do?

This must be a very frustrating situation. The law states that your landlord must provide accommodation that is safe, healthy and free from things that could cause serious harm.

You don't say exactly what repairs are needed. If you have problems such as electrical wiring that you think might be faulty, or there's damp, or an infestation by pests, the landlord has a legal obligation to put things right.

Landlords are also responsible for the maintenance of the general structure, and fittings such as boilers and radiators; basins, baths and toilets; and the drains.

The first step is to contact your landlord again, in writing. Include photographs of the problems. Keep a record of all communications and evidence relating to the disrepair.

If that doesn't prompt any action, the advisers at Citizens Advice can help with next steps. These could include contacting your local council (who will have dedicated officers for dealing with disrepair in private rented properties) or asking for a visit by the environmental health team.

Tenants can take their landlords to court to force them to carry out repairs. However, it's worth getting some advice and thinking carefully before embarking on this route.




