

## Memories of a Village Resident The War Years

Iris was born in the house she still lives in, overlooking the airfield in Wetheringsett. She was 8 years old when the second World War started



and has vivid memories of the activities of the American aircraft close to her home.

She lived with her parents and older sister, Gladys, plus two cousins from London who came to live with them. Living close to an airfield was perhaps not the safest place to be.

The table in the main room provided shelter for them all when any bombs fell.

Iris remembers a bomb falling one fine night in a field close by and believes it was a farmer – Jack – who was out ploughing at the time and it was the light he was creating which drew the attention of the bomber!

They all dived under the table and others, outside at the time – among them Sidney Rose and her cousin Jeff – all dived into the ditch! Scary times; also sad memories of USAF planes trying to reach 'home'. Looking out of the bedroom window one night she remembers screaming at the sight of a plane all ablaze and seemingly coming straight at the house. One plane

crashed at the top of Town Lane and one close to where the Middy is now. But Iris recalls one, with all its windows shot out, that actually made a safe landing.

Planes, sat two by two, filled the airfield from Town Lane to Lacey's Corner. The field hospital and Airmen's quarters were situated close by Town Lane.

Iris's memory of D-Day -

"There were so many planes flying over that you couldn't see the sky"

### Message from the Parish Council

The Parish Council pays for several dog bins placed around the village, but if you can't find one please take your dog mess home.

## Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on the meeting held Monday 8th February 2022

<u>Spring Litter Pick</u> – a community litter pick has been arranged for Saturday 26 March 2022, starting at Wetheringsett Village Hall at 10am. Volunteers to help would be really welcome. All equipment will be supplied, ie litter pickers, high viz vests, bin bags. Please do contact the Chairman or Clerk if you require any further information - your help with this important annual clean-up would be much appreciated.

<u>Footpaths</u> — Cllr Mrs Elizabeth Aldred was pleased to report the majority of footpaths were in a good condition. Some dog fouling issues have however been reported on footpaths, particularly in the area of the airfield. It would be much appreciated if dog owners could please pick up after their dogs to ensure the enjoyment of footpaths for all parishioners and children.

**Excessive vehicle speeds** – Cllr Charles Harvey reported on recent data from the VAS equipment at various locations around the village. Some disturbing speeds, in excess of 100mph, have been recorded particularly in Brockford Street. These are very worrying results and had occurred at varying times of the day, night and early hours of the morning. The data will be forwarded to the Police & Crime Commissioner and local Police Constabulary for action.

<u>Village Hall</u> — Cllr Mike Pease reported the new windows on the north wall funded by the Parish Council had been installed. The outside rendering was complete and would be painted in the spring. A cleaning weekend will take place over the last weekend of February and Cllr Pease was pleased to report bookings were now being taken.

Enormous thanks were recorded for the donation to rebuild the south wall and on behalf of the Parish Council and community the Chair recorded huge thanks to Cllr Mike Pease for all the hard work he had put into the project, without his enthusiasm the refurbishment would not have happened.

Cllr Pease went on to report on arrangements for the Platinum Tea Party celebrations on Friday 3 June, 2pm – 5pm. The Village Hall Committee had allocated funds up to £500 for the event and it was hoped sponsorship for the remainder could be obtained.

<u>Children's Play Area</u> – Cllr Barry Lacey reported on improvement works due to take place during the spring, these included removal of the sleepers and replacement with a grassed slope and a new bark surface under the climbing frame.



## A Celebration of Nature

## Trees Talk to Each Other

Walking past trees most of us are probably unaware of the communication that exists between them. They are involved in great struggles and death-defying dramas.

Wise old mother trees feed their saplings with liquid sugar and warn their neighbours when danger approaches. It's all happening in ultraslow motion that is 'tree time', so that what we see is one moment frozen in time. Trees are far more alert, social, sophisticated, and even intelligent, than we realise. It is thought that two trees living in close proximity share



sunlight and their root systems are closely connected. When one dies, the other will follow suit, because they are dependent on each other. Trees of the same species are communal, and will often form alliances with trees of other species.

It is underground that the real action is taking place. This has led to it being called the 'wood-wide web'. Trees are connected to each other through underground fungal networks. They share water and nutrients through the networks, and also use them to communicate. Scientists call these mycorrhizal networks. Fungal filaments join with the fine hair like root tips of the trees and together form the basic links of the network. A sort of economic exchange takes place. The fungi consume 30% of the sugar that trees photosynthesize from sunlight and this in turn fuels the fungi while they gather nitrogen, phosphorous and other mineral nutrients which are then absorbed and consumed by the trees. For young saplings in deeply shaded parts of a forest it offers a lifeline and they survive because big trees, including their parents, pump sugar into their roots through the network. There are many other forms of communication that are just being understood. So when we walk amongst trees we shouldn't take them for granted. Like us they live, communicate and care for each other.

#### What's happening in March?

Spring is finally on its way and we celebrate Pancake Day, saints days, World Book Day - and at the end of the month British Summer Time begins. After the long winter months, and the even longer period of Covid restrictions, we begin to look forward with hope to better and brighter days ahead.

This month we continue the 'What's happening' series by taking a look at key events, festivals and special days. March begins with one of my favourite days - Shrove Tuesday. Pancake Day or Shrove Tuesday is the day before Lent begins, when people would traditionally use up all their fat and eggs by making pancakes. Shrove Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday, the first day of the Christian festival of Lent. Lent is the period of forty days before Easter when traditionally Christians would fast and pray, in remembrance of the forty days that Jesus spent fasting in the desert whilst being tempted by Satan. Nowadays people either give up something they like during Lent, or give to charity or take on a challenge, such as 40 Acts of Kindness.

1st March is also St. David's Day. He is the patron saint of Wales, and celebrations include wearing daffodils and leeks, eating traditional Welsh food and wearing Welsh national costume. St. Patrick's Day on 17th March celebrates Ireland's patron saint. The day is celebrated all around the world with Guinness and shamrock decorations. When I was a child my Irish granny always sent me shamrock on a bed of moss in a special little green box.

Our schools will no doubt enjoy celebrating World Book Day, 3rd March and joining in with Red Nose Day on 18th March - the day when people raise money for good causes in the UK and around the world.

In our churches we will be celebrating the World Day of Prayer on 4th March at 10.30 in Gislingham church. This is a global day of prayer when more than 170 countries join in prayer and action for peace and justice, and it brings together races, cultures and churches in fellowship and understanding; and on 27th March we will be celebrating Mothering Sunday with the opportunity to give thanks, remember, light candles and receive traditional posies of flowers.

CONNECT will be holding 2 Community Celebrations at All Saints Church - a Pancake Party with pancake races and 'decorate your own pancake' on 27th February, and Mothering Sunday Afternoon Tea on 27th March, both at 4.00pm

Whatever you do this month, may you look forward with hope to better and brighter days.






I've just been offered a new job and now I need to tell my current employer. The new company wants me to start as soon as possible. The problem is, we're already a bit short-staffed where I am now and I don't know how soon I'll be allowed to leave. How should I bring all this up with my boss?

Congratulations on your new role. It can feel awkward telling your current employer you're moving on. The time between telling your employer you've found a new position and you actually leaving is known as your notice period. If you've been in your current job for less than a month, you won't have to give any notice period (unless your contract says otherwise). If it's more than a month, you'll have to give at least one week's notice. Your contract should make it clear exactly how long is expected.

If you don't have a contract, and your employer has no written record of you agreeing to a notice period, you should give at least one week's notice. It's worth waiting until your new employer has confirmed your employment, for example by giving you a start date before handing in your resignation. It's then best to resign in writing (email is fine), so that you have a record of the date you told your employer. On the Citizens Advice website we have a section on resigning with tips on how to write this letter. This can be found at citizensadvice.org.uk/work/leaving-a-job.


You can work a longer notice than the one in your contract, if you agree it with your employer. If you're keen to move on sooner rather than later, it may also be possible to negotiate a shorter notice period than your contract says. If you want to go down this route, it can be useful to reassure your current employer that you will tackle any urgent work before finishing.

Fixed-term contracts are a bit different, as you won't need to give notice if you intend to leave on the last day of contract. Leaving early would usually mean giving at least one week's notice, unless your contract says otherwise.

Don't forget about your holiday days during your notice period. If you have unused paid holiday you should speak to your employer about either taking these during the notice period or being paid for them.

Finally, sometimes people can change their mind about moving jobs or find their circumstances alter. If this happens to you, you should speak to your current employer to see what the options are and if you can stay in your current role.
