

Memories of a Village Resident School days

A fireplace in the classroom and outside toilets; the playground partitioned so the boys and girls had to play separately! This was Wetheringsett School in the 1930s when Iris attended.



Iris attended Wetheringsett School from the age of five, and, as was the case then, she continued at the same school until leaving at the age of fourteen. Getting to school meant a walk from Park Green and back when she was five, but if it rained her mum would collect her on the back of her bike. Her older sister Gladys was able to ride to school as she had a bike of her own and when Iris was seven her father bought her a bike as well—but it needed wooden blocks on the pedals as it was a little too large!

Iris attended the school when Mr Hurrell was the headteacher. Headteachers and their families lived in the adjoining schoolhouse at that time. She recalls being taught by Mrs Hurrell—the headteacher's wife, and also remembers teachers called Miss Baylam and Miss Elliott (who was 'especially nice'!) School dinners were provided and cooked on premises in the Village Hall. Mrs Brett was the Head Cook. However, Iris preferred to take sandwiches for lunch— made with homemade bread baked in the oven next to the fire. "Trust me to be different!", comments Iris



Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on the meeting held Monday 4 April 2022

<u>Parish Council Vacancy</u> – huge thanks were recorded to Mike Pease who has decided to retire from the council due to other commitments. The Parish Council is grateful to Mike for all his work on behalf of the council and in particular his efforts in co-ordinating the refurbishment work on the village hall – now a hugely improved building available for the enjoyment of the community. Mike will continue as a contact for the defibrillator at the village hall and will continue to carry out fortnightly checks on the equipment.

The parish council vacancy is currently being advertised, if any parishioner, 18 years and older is interested in joining the council please do speak to a councillor or the clerk for further information, we would be very pleased to hear from you. Meetings are held monthly on the first Monday of the month (unless that day is a Bank Holiday), please do attend to observe a council meeting in progress if you think you may be interested.

Annual Parish Meeting – the village meeting will be held on Monday 9 May 2022, 7pm at the Village Hall. There will be an Open Session for parishioners – an ideal opportunity to make comments/suggestions about the village plus reports from community groups. Mr Robert Townshend, Chairman of the Neighbourhood Plan Working Group will attend to give a report on progress of the Neighbourhood Plan and its benefits to the village and community. The meeting is open to all.

Following recent issues surrounding the Neighbourhood Planning process and administration, District Cllr Stringer reported on a MSDC proposed motion to reaffirm its support for communities working on or who have made Neighbourhood Plans and was pleased to report the motion was approved.

<u>Development at Brockford</u> – the Parish Council had been asked by MSDC to suggest a road name for the new development on Brockford Street. The suggestion of Ribbons Way was put forward in memory of the former owner, the late Mrs Ribbons. This has been accepted by MSDC.

<u>Platinum Jubilee Celebrations</u> – on behalf of the Village Hall committee Cllr Mrs Rachel Leech gave an update on preparations for the celebrations on 5 June next, a grand Tea Party on the Village Hall field. A separate report on arrangements is available in the magazine.

Date of next meeting – the annual parish council meeting will be held on Monday 9 May 2022 at 7.45pm at the Village Hall, Wetheringsett. The meeting will be open to the public and parishioners may take part in the meeting during the public session.


