



Snippets from the Village History:

The Able-Bodied Poor and Settlement Certificates (Chapter 9 in 'The Village History')

The sick and infirm in the parish were adequately cared for. The able bodied men without jobs had a rough time. If there was no work in their own parish, they could and did, seek for work elsewhere. But the other parishes were very wary of employing them since if they worked in another parish for a full year or moved into a house in another parish and stayed there for forty days, they gained what was called a settlement, which meant that the parish of their adoption had to care for them if they became destitute from sickness or for other reasons.

No parish wanted to spend money on people from another parish. Employers were exhorted to dismiss employees before the full year was up. Parishes were allowed to evict people likely to become paupers (the means test used was that the incomers had to rent a house worth more than £10 a year), and because of the 40 days residence qualification, they were allowed to evict immediately. Anyone coming to the parish for a temporary stay must bring a certificate from his own parish agreeing to take him back if he should become chargeable on the rates.

There is a document in the parish chest dated 22nd October 1674 stating that a Willian Reve and his wife have come into the parish and 'will' not give security (to discharge the parish from all expense it might incur), and are in a house under the value of £10 a year. They are to be sent back to Yaxley. It was the duty of the parish constable to escort such unfortunate people to the boundary to the next constable of the parish and hand them over, and so on , until they reach their own parish. The expenses involved were often considerable.




1976 or 2022?

September Newsletter 2022

September is a real time for new starts: children and their parents starting a new school or a new school year, young people off to college or uni... there are so many ways we take those next steps on our journeys around the academic calendar.

Of course, with these next steps come worries. What are you worrying about at the moment? Most of us carry a sack of worries with us! Family, job, cost of living, home, health... the list can feel never ending at times. It was just the same in



Jesus' day. It's easy to say, 'Don't worry,' to one another, and indeed the Bible says, 'Don't worry,' too, but it's pretty hard to put that not worrying into action. Jesus gives us a practical alternative: 'Consider the lilies of the field,' he says. Sounds a bit weird, you say. Well, you can find the whole story in **Matthew 6:25-33** but, basically, it's an invitation to step off the treadmill of our busy lives and simply be in the moment, to see the beauty of the world around us, in detail. Today we might call it mindfulness, in earlier times they called it the sacrament of the present moment. In stopping for long enough to see the beauty and extraordinary colour and form of the flowers and leaves all around us we are entering into the gift of the world around us.

So, take a moment to stop, pause and look. Think about what you are worried about and take a moment to lay it down for a while. If it's your thing, you can allow God to hold your worry, if not, just try to set it aside and enjoy some peace and quiet. My peaceful time, when I am able to hand things over to God, is when I am doodling. Recently I saw a great quote that said, 'Listen and silent are spelled with the same letters. Think about it.' I did think about it – and I found it really powerful; because sometimes we think we are listening, but we aren't really because we haven't silenced all of the things that are churning round inside our heads. Sometimes to silence those things we need to name them.

Of course, none of this solves any of our worries but it might just give us the headspace or calmness to think things through more clearly. And remember, your church community is here to offer help too. If you'd like a listening ear, just get in touch.



Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on the meeting held Monday 1st August 2022

<u>Village Hall</u> – approval was received from the Dept of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities for the Parish Council Ioan of £16,867 from the Wetheringsett Church and Town Estate Charity. The Ioan has enabled the refurbishment of the Village Hall floor to be completed without which the Hall would not have been able to re-open. On behalf of the community the Council expressed its enormous thanks to the Charity for facilitating the Ioan which will be re-paid over the next 9 years at a 1% pa interest rate. Thanks were also recorded to the village hall committee and all those involved in organising and facilitating the refurbishment work which has provided the community with a hugely improved meeting place for years to come.

Defibrillator – there had been a suggestion of installing a defibrillator in Brockford Street. It was reported the defibrillator at the village hall had been used twice and that had been by the ambulance service. Members were of the view the current defibrillator was central and close to Brockford Street so it was decided not to progress this at present.

Parish Pond – Wetherup Street – following concerns raised that normally the water in the pond was deep it was agreed a Deep Water sign should be erected. This has been obtained by Cllr Barry Lacey and he will arrange for it to be put up near the pond.

<u>Grasscutting</u> – Cemetery/Play Area – due to the very dry conditions this year there has been very little grasscutting to date, the cemetery has been cut only once. It was agreed a cut and strim would be required in the cemetery before the end of the cutting season to ensure it looked tidy over the winter months.

<u>Play Area at Village Hall</u> – Cllr Lacey stated work on the proposed removal of the sleepers and replacement with a grass slope would take place after the school holidays and children were back at school as the play area would need to be closed for two or three weeks for the work to be carried out – this will involve the use of a mini digger. It was believed this would be a huge improvement and thanks were recorded to Cllr Lacey for overseeing the work.

<u>Village Sign</u> – it was reported refurbishment of the Village Sign damaged during the February gales was progressing. It was hoped this would be complete by the autumn.

<u>**Planning**</u> – a number of planning applications were considered for recommendation to MSDC Planning. Full details of these are available on the MSDC website.



What does one have to say about

them? They are nice to look at and... do you own one, or would you like to? Very few are worth much where they stand. The cost of cutting one down, cutting it up, transporting it to be processed is high and a very low percentage are worth doing that.

I have been planting about 1000 trees a year since 'plant a tree in 73' but we don't have 50,000 more than 50 years ago. 1976 was a very dry year, and several more have had hot dry spells with high losses. We try to look after them but the nettles and brambles have vigorous growth even after we spray round the sapling, and some do not survive. Also, latterly, we plant more shrubs which are low light tolerant, to put some bottom into the woods, which, after 20 years, would be too dark even for the nettles and briars.

Trees in the countryside should be no problem to anybody. But what about the trees next to the roads, oft with power or phone cables entwined? And, of course, those near houses or buildings? Should we cut down all these magnificent oaks, or perhaps commission Michael Fish's successor to give a month's warning of the next 1987 storm.

If you are in your new house on Hockey Hill looking upwards at a splendid Ash tree, which would cross the road if it fell, you might ask yourself: Which came first, the tree or the house? Then ponder as to the maxim that there is no such thing as an act of God

The cost of energy and food is so high now. With the kids home from school for the summer, I'm having to pay more for lunches and snacks. I'm worried about how I'll put food on the table. I'm on a prepayment meter and I'm really scared we're going to be left without any gas or electric if I can't top up. What can I do?

First of all, I'm really sorry to hear how tough things

have been for you. You're doing the right thing in reaching out for support and there are things you can get help with.

As a prepayment meter customer, your energy supplier will be able to give you temporary credit if you can't afford to top up your meter. They might add this to your meter automatically, but if they don't, you can call them and ask them to do this. If you run out of temporary credit, speak to your supplier to explain your situation. They may give you extra temporary credit if you're struggling with living costs. There are other reasons why they might give you extra credit too, including if you're disabled, have a long -term health condition, or you have children under the age of 5. You'll have to pay back anything extra you get, but you can agree how to do this in a way you can afford with your supplier.

As you say, the cost of living is really high but there is help available. If you pay council tax and you're in bands A-D, you should get a payment of £150 automatically. It could take until the end of September, but if you've not had it already you might need to make a claim.

You might also be able to get help from the Household Support Fund, which helps those experiencing financial hardship. They can offer support with energy bills, with food or other essentials.

There's more government support coming from October in the form of a £400 payment to help you with your energy bills. If you have a prepayment meter, you'll be given vouchers in the first week of each month from October, via text, email or post. Make sure your energy company has your up-to-date details.

To help manage other costs, it's also worth checking you're getting all the benefits you're entitled to. There are benefits calculators you can use online or Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can complete a benefit check for you. If you can't afford to buy food, Citizens Advice also can help you get a referral for a food bank.

We know this is an extremely worrying time and everyone's situation is different. Don't struggle alone.
