

"STAND & DELIVER"



It is another beautiful Autumn morning; bright, crisp and mist beginning to clear. I am out in the garden cutting willow, and collecting berries and crab apples. I am getting ready for another Connect Session. This week the craft will be making Autumn wreaths.

For anyone who hasn't been to a Connect Session or heard about Connect yet, let me tell you a little bit about it.

CONNECT is a welcoming and safe space for people of all ages to gather. It aims to connect church and the wider community by building on a sense of community, tackle social isolation and offer a meeting place for those who work during the week Connect runs weekly at 4.00pm on a Sunday at Thorndon, we have monthly Connect celebrations that run at Thorndon and Wetheringsett on Sundays and at Mellis (usually on a Saturday). There is also a Connect After School Club at Wetheringsett C of E Primary School.

The idea of each session is that there is something for every age:

Café Connect – a café style area serving hot drinks, cakes and biscuits. This is a safe space to chat and relax, there is a play area for children of all ages Connect Crafts – craft activities for all ages, using recycled materials or sustainable products.

Connect Outdoors – supporting and maintaining the churchyard to be an ecofriendly environment for wildlife, trees and plants

Connexions - Table Talk, prayer stations, and prayer requests. Someone is always on hand if you want to chat or share a concern

Connected – a short act of worship with drama/storytelling, music and a thought for the day.

Sustainability is very important to us when planning crafts. During the Covid lockdowns we did several zoom sessions with craft ideas. We didn't want anyone to have to go out to buy anything, so all the crafts we showed were from things you may have in your home.

We make sure that all the craft activities use either recycled or natural materials. This year we have not spent a single penny on craft materials - some examples are Willow wreath, Christmas decorations from wood and pebbles, and flowers made from old buttons.

We look forward to welcoming you to join us at Connect anytime!

Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on the meeting held Monday 3 October 2022

Play Area – Cllr Barry Lacey reported on the improvement works carried out – the removal of the rotted sleepers and replacement with a grassed slope. This was now complete and the area would be closed off for a few weeks to enable the soil to settle and the grass seed to germinate. Thanks were recorded to Barry for overseeing the work.

EV Charging – County Cllr Stringer reported on Suffolk County Council's successful bid for funding towards new EV charging infrastructure. The £2.75km funding will focus on community-owned carparks where charging can be accessed 24/7. Parish and Town Councils were being invited to express an interest should they wish to consider taking part in the scheme. Parish Councillors believed the Village Hall car park would be an ideal location for a charging point. An expression of interest has been registered on behalf of Wetheringsett

Electric Buses - In his District Council role Cllr Stringer reported a new group of District Councillors had been set up at MSDC to oversee the procurement of two electric buses agreed in the last District Council budget. The group had met and agreed the demand responsive model using an existing service provider was the best way forward. Councillors have asked the District Council to progress this as soon as possible.

See the Light – Cllr Stringer went on to report that Photovoltaic panels were now among the cheapest ways of generating electricity, with current government policy encouraging its use on lesser quality agricultural land. With rocketing prices for wholesale energy the pressure to build out grid scale solar was relentless, however recent applications have seen significant resistance from host communities with the most recent application for 4 acres of grade 3c land in Rickinghall refused, many councillors stating that they preferred solar panels to be installed on new buildings rather than agricultural land, however a recent planning application for 3 commercial warehouses in Wetheringsett with a roof space of almost 3 acres was approved, with plans showing not one square metre of Solar Panels in the whole project.

These cases outline the challenges of a slow-moving policy framework in a fast-moving energy transition.

Royal British Legion – two Parish Council Wreaths have been ordered, one for the Memorial Service at Wetheringsett and the other for the USAAF Memorial at Mendlehsam. Cllrs Mrs Elizabeth Aldred and Mrs Ann Arnold will lay the wreaths on behalf of the Council.



The cost of things just keeps going up. The food shop doesn't stretch as far and my bills just keep getting higher. I've made cutbacks and, at the moment, I'm just about managing but I'm really worried about how I'll cope as it starts getting colder. What should I do?

You're not alone in struggling with rising costs, but it's important to know there is support available.

If you're finding it hard to stay on top of bills, make sure you know what money you've got coming in and out each month. Citizens Advice has an online budgeting tool that can help with this - visit citizensadvice.org.uk/debt-and-money to find this tool and more.

It's also worth finding out if you're eligible for any benefits or support with your energy and living costs. On the Citizens Advice website citizens advice.org.uk there's a benefits calculator, advice on how to reduce living costs and information on other ways to increase your income.

The good news is there is help with rising energy bills. From 1 October 2022, there's a limit on gas and electricity prices for most households - this is called the Energy Price Guarantee and will be in place for two years.

From October you'll also get £400 off your electricity bill. This is called the Energy Bills Support Scheme.

You don't need to do anything to get the money and you won't have to pay it back. The money will be paid in six instalments, you'll get £66 in October and November followed by £67 in December, January, February and March.

You should automatically receive the energy discount if you pay by direct debit, standard credit or payment card.

If you have a prepayment meter that isn't a smart meter, you'll get the discount via vouchers or as an automatic credit when you top up at your usual top-up point. Your supplier will let you know how they will issue it.

If you have a smart prepayment meter, the credit should be automatically added to your meter.

If you can't pay your bills, speak to your energy supplier as they have a responsibility to help you come up with a solution.
