

Update on the Wetheringsett cum Brockford

Neighbourhood Plan

Following the public consultation exercise held over the Summer of 2022, the Neighbourhood Plan was amended and submitted to Mid Suffolk District Council (MSDC)at the beginning of December 2022.

Mid Suffolk are now intending to carry out further consultation on the amended plan between **Monday 23**rd **January and Friday 10**th **March 2023.**

Details of the amended Plan, the supporting documents and how to make comments are all contained on the Wetheringsett cum Brockford page of the MSDC website: <u>https://www.babergh.gov.uk/planning/neighbourhood-planning/neighbourhood-planning/neighbourhood-planning/in-mid-suffolk/wetheringsett-cum-brockford-neighbourhood-plan/</u>

Hard copies of the Plan are available to view/inspect in the porch of All Saints Church, Wetheringsett, during the consultation period. Please return the hard copies to the Church once you have finished with them.

This is your final opportunity to comment on the policies in the Neighbourhood Plan before it is examined by an independent examiner at the end of March 2023. If the Plan passes the examination it will them be the subject of a Referendum later in the year.

As this is a formal stage, comments on the plan must be made in **writing** so please follow the details on the MSDC website.

Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on the meeting held Monday 9 January 2023

Parish Councillors send their good wishes to all for a happy and peaceful New Year

PARISH SPRING LITTER PICK – SUNDAY 5 MARCH 2023 – 10AM – 1PM

Volunteers from the village to help with the litter pick on the above date would be very much appreciated. Meet at the Village Hall just before 10am – Litter Pickers, High Viz Vests and Bin Bags will be provided. Please provide your own gloves. Please contact any councillor or the clerk if you require any further information.

<u>A140 at Brockford Street – speeding</u>: an automatic number plate recognition camera was located in Brockford Street for one week during December. It is hoped the data from the camera will be received shortly. Councillors have also discussed siting an Average Speed Camera in Brockford Street. Details have been sent to the County Councillor who will discuss this with County Highways.

Parish Precept – a precept sum of £12,500 was agreed for the forthcoming financial year 2023-24. This is an increase of approx. £2600 on last year and mainly due to the loan repayments for the Parish Council contribution to the village hall refurbishment, which has seen a much needed and huge improvement to the building for use by parishioners, and an allowance has been made for the parish council elections to be held during May this year. If the election is contested there could a cost of up to £1900 to the parish but is necessary to ensure due democratic procedures are followed.

<u>Village Hall</u> – the Village Hall Committee Chairman, Cllr Charles Harvey, reported on activities at the Village Hall – the Warm Space and Book Exchange will continue on Monday afternoons and thanks were recorded to Cllr Stringer for the grant of £1800 to help fund the events. There is an urgent need for more people to join the village hall management committee - anyone able to offer a little of their spare time to help, particularly with events, would really be much appreciated. Please contact Charles if you are able to help.

<u>**Trees**</u> – the availability of young trees for parishioners was reported. These include Field Maple, Oak and Wild Cherry. Please contact Elizabeth Aldred on 01728 860482 if you are interested.

Neighbourhood Plan – the final draft of the Plan was approved by the Parish Council at the December meeting. This has been submitted to Mid Suffolk District Council for comment before final consultation with the village probably during May. Thanks were recorded to the Working Group for all their work on the Plan to date.

citizens advice Mid Suffolk

As the weather has turned colder, I've noticed mould and damp in our flat. It's mainly in our bedroom, including some black mould on the carpet. I've been chasing our letting agency, who say they'll speak to our landlord. I'm really worried about how this might affect our health. Our tenancy agreement isn't up for eight months, what can I do?

It's good that you've already raised the issue with your letting agency. Unfortunately, it isn't always easy to work out the cause of mould or damp This can make it difficult to work out if your landlord is responsible, unless there's an obvious cause, like a leaking roof.

There are many causes of damp that properties can get. The most common are rising, penetrating, construction and condensation damp. On our website there is information that may help you work out what type of damp you have, who is responsible and what you can do. Check your tenancy agreement too for mentions of repairs and damp, and reach out to Citizens Advice on anything you're unsure about. A landlord will have to act in relation to damp if it makes the property unsafe for someone to live in. This could be for example, if it is making the tenant or a member of their family ill. The landlord will also be responsible if the damp is related to repairs they should have carried out, like if heaters are broken. If the damp has damaged items that the landlord is responsible for, such as carpets and window frames, they'll likely have to cover the cost of repairs.

One of the most common causes of damp is condensation. To prevent this, it's important to keep homes well-heated and well-ventilated, but for a lot of people this will be trickier to do given the colder weather and higher heating costs. You may be eligible for help to insulate and heat your home, and should visit our website to find out more.

On our website we also have advice on things that can make damp worse and may impact the landlord taking responsibility for repairs. These include drying clothes on heaters or blocking air vents.

If your landlord is responsible for the damp in your property but doesn't act, there are steps you can take, such as reporting them to the local authority. If you're in social housing you might also be able to use the landlord's formal complaints procedure. There is more information about this on our website. If it reaches the point where you want to get out of a fixed term tenancy agreement early, speak to Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk first, as there might be better ways to approach the issue. Meanwhile our 39 members continue with their own projects or communal projects; currently we have 35

live projects registered and 46 completed so far. Comfortable seating is being built in the galley, while other projects in hand or recently completed include a new village sign for Mickfield, possible renovation of benches for Debenham Bowls Club, a bicycle renovation (sold) and a welding repair for a table in Dove Cottage.

Our 1976 MG Midget now has operating windows, headlights and other minor improvements. New suspension springs are on their way after a long delay, and following their installation at Debenham Garage it will be moved to Cambridge for a free respray. Once complete it will be sold to generate funds for the shed, including a defibrillator.

We have raised so far over £1,000 through sale of donated tools, furniture, renovations and other items. To protect these goods and larger equipment from the weather we have applied for grants to enclose a lean-to area on one side of the shed, providing storage space and at the same time a wheelchair ramp to our composting toilet; planning permission has been granted.
