



Aidan Wright had fantastic success on the weekend of 11/12 February when he reached the final of the Under 15's 300m race at the England Indoor Athletics Championships held in Sheffield. He came 5th with his best indoor time of 39.44s and is currently ranked 6th overall in the U15 UK rankings at 300m.

Aidan, who attended Wetheringsett Primary School, is now in Year 9 at Debenham High School and is a member of Ipswich Harriers Athletics Club.

After achieving 3rd place in the 300m at the Eastern Athletics Championships last year, it is great to see him progressing to the National races and he hopes for continued success on the outdoor track this season.

Wetheringsett cum Brockford Grasscutting Required



WILDLIFE CONSERVATION PROJECT

Pitmans Corner, Wetheringsett



Here at Pitmans Corner, we are continuing to encourage biodiversity of the ponds and verges adjacent to the track that provides private access to our four properties situated just off High Lane. The track runs along a designated Public Footpath (no. 19) and is 'unadopted', meaning responsibility that for its maintenance rests with the residents, as it has for fifty or more years. We are particularly mindful of the importance of safe for ensuring passage footpath users.

In November 2021, one thousand naturalising daffodils were planted along the length of the left hand verge, together with 100 wild garlic bulbs. This past autumn, some snowdrops and bluebells in the green were also planted. They are costly, though, and since our project is self-funded, it will be a few years before the snowdrops and bluebells make an impact.

Over the past year, too, the bug hotel has been refurbished, and there have been some tentative signs of interest shown in the new bat box.

The crowning glory, though, is the display of naturalising daffodils which have taken well. If last year is anything to go by, there will be a magnificent display this coming spring.

As I write this, I am enjoying seeing first signs of new growth; in many of our churchyards snowdrops are a particularly beautiful sight – so perfectly small and hopeful.

As you read this, we will be well into the season of Lent. Lent is the period of 40 days before Easter. It starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Easter Eve. But if you look in a calendar and count the days and they come to more than 40. Don't be perplexed – this is because you don't count the Sundays in Lent!

Rather like Advent, Lent is seen as a time of preparation. The church colour for both seasons is purple, which is traditionally a royal colour, helping us to remember that Jesus is King and that he died at Easter. If you go into a church doing Lent you will see that things like the altar cloth are purple to show this and when I am doing a service during Lent I will wear a purple stole.

Of course, the most popular and well known tradition during Lent is to give something up, a tradition which originated from the stricter fasting practices. Maybe you have decided to give up a luxury during Lent this year?

In my day job as a Primary Church School Headteacher we talk to the children about these things. It can be really amusing to hear them be very keen to give up their least favourite vegetable!

More and more there is a new tradition of people trying to do positive things during Lent. At my school we often participate in things such as '40 Acts of Kindness' or '40 Acts of Generosity'. It is a great way to put others first. Imagine the impact if we all tried to add in extra kindness or generosity every day.

Mothering Sunday also falls during Lent. Traditionally, in the 16th Century, this was when people were expected to visit their 'mother' church. If that was too far to travel they would go to their nearest Cathedral. Later on, it was a day when maids and servants had a day off to go back and visit their mothers and families. It can be a tough day for those of us who miss their mums. If you would like to light a candle, have a few moments of peace and quiet or join us for a Mothering Sunday Service or any other, whether it be with your family or in celebration or remembrance – you will all be very welcome.



CONDENSATION

Have you suffered from condensation in the house this year?! It must be the weather!

Anyway, it is not helped by the lack of ventilation. Often the roof space does not have enough, if any, ventilation and if there is not adequate air flow when moist air contacts a cold surface we get wet drops forming and if the situation persists one has a wet loft, which may seep through the ceiling.

Secondly, if the house has all doors and windows always shut and a warm atmosphere, in a muggy situation- kettle left boiling etc, then there will be condensation, usually on the windows first. Open the windows and reduce the humidity. What? After spending so much to heat the place?! The alternative is to buy a dehumidifier, and enjoy the distilled water it produces - very good with whiskey!

Condensation needs ventilation for evaporation.

My employer asked me to work some extra hours lately, but I don't appear to have received the extra pay. I asked my boss about it and they said they would look into it, but I don't seem to be getting anywhere. What should I do?

If you think your pay is wrong, or you haven't been paid for extra hours worked, the best thing you can do is talk to your employer and find out what's going on. If you and your employer can't agree on how much you should have been paid, you can challenge them. You should act quickly though — it'll be harder to get your money after 3 months from the date the problem arose.

You should start by checking your payslip if you've got one. This will help you see how your pay has been worked out. Check things like:

Whether you've been paid for the number of hours you've actually worked

If you've been paid at the correct rate

If you've been paid overtime, a commission or a bonus

Whether you've been paid any sick pay

If your employer has deducted any money that you weren't expecting

Ask your employer to explain anything you don't understand on your payslip or why you haven't been paid what you believe you are owed. If you disagree with anything, explain why. If your employer has made a genuine mistake, ask them to pay you the money you're owed straight away – you should not have to wait until your next pay day.


up. However, we have started taking registrations for 2023, and half last year's swimmers have applied.

Our next Craft Day will be on Saturday 11 March from 9am to 12pm, which will include the following activities:-




~ Motorbike electrics, especially vintage machines a practical session in the barn (charge £5)



Local Elections 4 May 2023

From 4 May 2023, voters in England will need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections. This will apply to:

- Local elections
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections
- UK parliamentary by-elections

Recall petitions

From October 2023 it will also apply to UK General elections.

Accepted forms of photo ID

You can use any of the following accepted forms of photo ID when voting at a polling station.

International travel

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- Driving and Parking
- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence)

A Blue Badge

Local travel

- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- Oyster 60+ Card
- Freedom Pass
- Scottish National Entitlement Card
- 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card
- Senior SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- Registered Blind SmartPass or Blind Person's SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- War Disablement SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- 60+ SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland

Half Fare SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland

Local Elections 4 May 2023 continued ...

Proof of age

Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)

Other government issued documents

- Biometric immigration document
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- National identity card issued by an EEA state
- Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland

Voter Authority Certificate

Anonymous Elector's Document

You will only need to show one form of photo ID. It needs to be the original version and not a photocopy.

If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID

You can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate, if:

- you don't have an accepted form of photo ID
- you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you you're worried about using an existing form of ID for any other reason, such as the use of a gender marker

You need to <u>register to vote</u> before applying for a Voter Authority Certificate.

Out of date photo ID

You can still use your photo ID if it's out of date, as long as it looks like you.

The name on your ID should be the same name you used to register to vote.

Showing ID as an anonymous elector

If you're registered to vote anonymously and want to vote in person, you'll need to apply for an <u>Anonymous Elector's</u> <u>Document</u>.
