Memories of Wetheringsett-Cum-Brockford

Local historian, **Dennis Cross** from Diss, shares with us his fascinating collection of old postcards, focusing on a different village in every issue. This time, we take a walk down memory lane in Wetheringsett-Cum-Brockford



▲ Looking towards Stoke Ash along the A140, the long-closed Griffin pub in 1912. John Turner was landlord at this time.



▲ Brockford in 1914, looking along the main street at thatched and tiled cottages. The building in the foreground was surgeons Dufton & Brickwell, who were medical officers serving the district.



▲ This 1929 postcard of thatched cottages in The Street in Wetheringsett was sent from the Post Office to Finchley Road, Ipswich. Mrs Maud Smith was postmistress at this time. The population was 822.



▲ A postcard of the Brockford village blacksmith's house, on the Ipswich Road, dated 10 July 1914, which was sent by an Aunt May to her nephew. The blacksmith was a Mr Rose.



▲ Wetheringsett Manor, seen here in 1912, was a handsome Elizabethan building, and the seat of Mr H T Morgan Esq.

Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council

Report of meeting held 7 August 2023

The meeting was not quorate and could not therefore proceed as a parish council meeting. Various reports were presented and noted as follows:

Community Speed Watch – six parishioners have volunteered to train and set up a Speed Watch scheme in the village following the many concerns over speeding through certain areas of the village, in particular Wetherup Street, Park Green, Hockey Hill and Brockford Street. The Group will meet to discuss the process required to train in use of the equipment. This will be with assistance from Suffolk Constabulary.

Public Transport – the provision of a bus through Wetheringsett for shoppers was raised at the July meeting following publication of Transport East funding. County Cllr Andrew Stringer stated the funding was for improvements to infrastructure for existing bus routes and not for the provision of new services. A service to and from the village was however available via the Connecting Communities scheme

The poster for Connecting Communities rural transport features a central graphic of a bus route connecting various locations like Shopping, Education, and Transport Connections. It includes a list of steps to use the service, a 'Why use it?' section with four benefits (Affordable, Flexible, Convenient, Modern), and logos for Suffolk County Council, Recycle for Suffolk, Traveline, and Suffolkonboard.

What is Connecting Communities?

If there are no regular bus services to make your journey or you are unable to get to your nearest bus stop, Connecting Communities is able to collect and connect you. The service can be booked online or by phone and costs the same as it would on a bus.

For longer journeys, the service will connect you to other bus or train services.

Connecting Communities could be used for social, appointments, study, shopping or work (multiple bookings can be taken in advance).

How to use it:

1. Call or request a journey online our team will be able to answer any questions you might have.
2. Book a journey
3. Travel to your destination
4. Fares are affordable and in line with local bus services

Mid Suffolk

September brings a new school year, one of my children is in primary school and the other secondary. Between uniforms, PE kit and knowing they'll need to catch the bus each day the costs are adding up. I'm already pretty stretched, so I'm not sure how to cover these extra outgoings. Is there any help I can get?

A new school year can put pressure on lots of people's budgets, so you're not alone in your worries.

But there is help available. If you are online, a good place to start is the Citizens Advice website at citizensadvice.org.uk/family/education/help-with-school-costs where you'll find lots of information on the support you might be entitled to for school-related costs. The help you can get to cover school lunches will vary depending on how old your children are and if you claim benefits. Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 automatically get free school meals. You can apply for free school meals for older children if you claim certain types of benefits, including Universal Credit, Child Tax Credit and Income Support.

You mentioned concerns about travel costs. If your child can't walk to school because of special educational needs or disabilities they should get free school transport. You may be able to get help with transport costs from Suffolk County Council if your children can't walk because it's dangerous or too far.

If you're on a low income, Suffolk County Council may also be able to help you with activity and school uniform costs. You're likely to be considered to be on a low income if you get means-tested benefits like Universal Credit or Housing Benefit. In some places there are also local charitable schemes that can help. A good place to find out about these is the school itself or Parent Teacher Association (PTA), as both will usually know if these kinds of schemes exist. A lot of people are feeling the squeeze at the moment, but it's important to remember that help is available with school costs and you're not alone.

If you need more information the advisers at Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk will be happy to help and can provide advice on issues including debt, finances, employment, benefits and family/relationships. 

Weeds

A Weed is a plant growing out of place.

There are many plants that grow in our gardens which we wish were not there but farmers often find their crops become weeds- a crop of barley grown one year sheds a few grain that appear in the next wheat crop, so they are weeds. Increasingly, we are encouraged to grow Wild Flower mixtures on small parts of the farm, like field corners where the sprayers find it difficult. They are not there so much for the flowers, but mostly for the seeds for small birds during the winter months. In the crops of wheat and beet they are weeds.

There are plants that are usually called weeds under most circumstances.

Cow Parsley has little use, and the Giant Hogweed has burst on the scene within the last few years with a vengeance: it is a bad skin irritant and grows to over 12ft/4m and is very invasive. This year ragwort has recently and suddenly widely shown itself. This is an illegal weed - except on British Rail embankments, (Government dispensation?) - as it is very poisonous to horses. . I am not sure they will eat it if standing but once cut, they love it, to death! They say that one man's meat is another man's poison. Adapt that to plants/weeds!



I am a novice allotment keeper. Over the last two cycle of seasons, I have started to appreciate the various times of growth, times of fallow and planting, of waiting for fruits to ripen and for the time of harvesting of, hopefully, an abundant crop.

Last year was a challenge as we baked in the extreme temperatures. This summer has brought challenges of its own, the rain and warmth has brought abundant fruit, of plants I chose and plants I didn't. I have a rather overgrown plot!



As I walk to my allotment passing fields, I see the wider challenges of the rain and hear of the anxiety of the farming community as they wait the ripening of their crops. I pray to the Lord, asking for the sun to shine and dry and ripen the grain heads, so the harvest can be gathered. I am writing this before the final harvest has been brought in but have anticipation that it will be gathered and that we will have much to be thankful for.

The news tells us of scarcity, the headlines tell of shortages of rice and wheat. Yet there are stories of hope and generosity. There are stories of communities working together to grow crops that use sustainable methods, both here in the UK and in other parts of the world. There are stories of abundance as people give with generous hearts. Food banks and porch pantries here in the UK are about people living and caring for one together, sharing in the goodness of God's provision. They are making small but significant changes. Ethiopia has had drought for the past five years and farmers are watching their crops and livestock die. Godana is one such farmer, yet he has hope. Pray for peace Godana says, for if a person has peace inside, they can get through the difficulties.

Jesus said, my peace I give you. No matter what our circumstances the gift of his peace is to help us get through the trials of life. The psalmist sing *'happy are those whose help is in the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth, the sea and all that is in them. Who keeps faith forever and brings justice to the oppressed.'* God's mercies are new every day. God's faithfulness and kindness continues, ready for us to choose to take hold of and to live in hope and with joy.

In the hedgerows hazel nuts, apples and blackberries are ripening, a reminder of God's abundance and generous love. This brings me joy and I have gathered handfuls of sweet blackberries while out and about. I have also tried to bless with small offerings from my garden, giving plums to several people. What I didn't anticipate was to be blessed in return with a large marrow and a handful of runner beans!
