





# Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report of meeting held 8 January 2024

<u>Parish Council Vacancies</u> — There are now two vacancies to be filled by cooption. Our councillors would be very pleased to hear from any parishioner who may be interested in joining the Council. Meetings are held on the first Monday of the month (with exception of a bank holiday), 7pm at the Village Hall. It is important the vacancies are filled to ensure the Council is fully represented. The work of the Parish Council includes recommendations to the District Council on planning applications, managing the finances of the council, monitoring highways, footpaths, trees, play equipment and generally being interested in the wellbeing of the village and its community. Please do let a councillor or the clerk know if you would like further information or would be interested in joining, we would be very pleased to hear from you.

Following his retirement from the Council, councillors recorded their thanks to Cllr Charles Harvey for his work on behalf of the village and community, particularly in relation to the VAS speed equipment, during his many years as a councillor, this has been much appreciated.

Storm Babet and flooding — the flooding issues sadly experienced by some parishioners are still ongoing. Our councillors reiterated the importance of all residents affected by flooding to register this on the Suffolk CC website in order to qualify for any government grants that should be forthcoming shortly. In the meantime County Cllr Stringer stated Suffolk CC would be issuing an infrastructure report on future improvements and a joint Suffolk CC, Environment Agency and MSDC meeting to discuss flooding will be held on 26 January 2024 (sessions at 1pm and 5pm) at Debenham Leisure Centre — Although the meeting will primarily discuss issues relating to the River Deben surrounding parishioners are very welcome to attend to raise concerns from surrounding villages. In the meantime the Parish Council is progressing review of its Emergency Plan and in particular setting up a Flood Emergency Working Group and one of the first tasks of the group will be to organise some ditch clearance where possible.

**Spring Litter Pick** — a date of Sunday 7 April 2024 has been agreed for a community litter pick. Volunteers to help on the day would be much appreciated. Equipment will be provided, ie high viz vests, litter pickers and black bin bags. Meet at the Wetheringsett Village Hall at 9.45am for a 10am start.

February Newsletter 2024



As I write I am in a reflective mood. Today is & December, a day that lives long in my memory. On that day in 1978, as a 10-year-old, I had insisted on walking home from school rather than being driven home by my mother. It was only when I regained consciousness some weeks later and being aware that I was in a hospital bed, with impaired vision, a thumping headache and my leg in plaster that I realised that something had not quite gone to plan.

I had been hit by a speeding pickup truck whilst crossing the road with the "lollipop" lady. The events of the day had put my parents through turmoil, and for a short time they had not known whether I was dead or alive. If it were not for the actions of a passing stranger, who removed my face from a puddle whilst others stood paralysed with fear, not knowing whether to move my motionless body, then maybe I would not be here to tell this story. I still carry his letter that he wrote to my parents wishing me well.

Then came the repercussions from my mother. Why had I insisted on walking home? Why hadn't the driver seen me? Why had he been driving so fast? And then my mother's guilt, that she had given me a choice and despite her reservations, she had allowed me to exercise free will, even if this was against her better judgement. In all this, she never stopped loving me or left her bedside vigil.

As I write, I am dealing with the aftermath of storm Babet. Fortunately, as distressing as it is to lose personal possessions and suffer property damage, there was no loss of life. Naturally there is some anger about how and why this flooding has happened, and who is to blame and was there more that could have been done to clear blocked drains and ditches. A while ago such events would have been called an "act of God", such as the 1953 floods, the 1987 hurricane and now the 2023 Storm Babet.

Perhaps it is only natural to question God, after all on the cross, had Jesus not questioned God when he exclaimed "My God my God, why have you abandoned me?". So, do we too ask why God allows such things to happen, do we question our faith, or help those who chose to blame a God they do not believe exists?

As I continue to reflect, I turn things round in my mind and if my mother were alive today, perhaps I would ask her about the events of 1978; why did the stranger stop and save me when others stood by? Why did I make a full recovery with no lasting disabilities (although some of course some would question what a large bang on the head has done to my personality!) and perhaps, most importantly why did I not die, as the chances of surviving an impact with a truck travelling 40 mph are just 15%?.

Coming back to storm Babet, perhaps it is an "act of mankind" and we are responsible for the events which are unfolding before us, more than just blocked drains and ditches, so some may say where is the relevance of God in all this? I believe that God allows us to believe or not believe, the freedom to choose and the freewill to effectively do as we please and go the way of our choosing, despite the disastrous consequences that follow. He loves us and will not abandon us, so in addition to the letter of 1978, I also carry the bible, as I believe in the goodness of mankind and also in God's love and mercy – I still have far more to thank Him for than many will ever know

# Are you aware ? There has been a Public Consultation on Library Services in Suffolk

Suffolk County Council has recently launched a public consultation encouraging Suffolk residents to tell the council what they want from their library services in the future.

This consultation ends on Friday 26 January 2024.

This consultation is being run by Suffolk County Council and not Suffolk Libraries.

It's part of the county council's process to shape the future of the library service, which is their statutory responsibility, and is not a consultation on how Suffolk Libraries has run the service over the past 12 years. Suffolk County Council's contract with Suffolk Libraries comes to an end on 31st May 2025, with a new contract et to begin in June 2025. The council is therefore seeking views

from the public about what is important to them, ahead of

awarding the new contract.

I've built up a bit of debt and I am panicking. Even though I cut back, Christmas was expensive, my rent has gone up and my paycheque just doesn't stretch as far as it used to. I'm doing everything I can but it's not enough - what can I do?

First of all it's important to know you're not alone in finding things difficult and, crucially, there's support available.

You say you've built up a bit of debt. The first step is to collect all the information you have about your debts. This might include contracts, bills and statements.

Next, make a list of your debts and write down the details of each. This could include whom you owe the money to (this person/company is your 'creditor'); when you first missed a payment; and how much you now owe. You'll also need to make a note of your account or reference number and what steps the creditor has taken to get the money back, eg. sending you letters.

It might feel overwhelming when you see all of your debts written down - but try not to worry, the important thing is that you're sorting them out.

If you're behind on household bills, prioritise paying your rent or mortgage, plus energy bills and Council Tax first. Not paying these bills has the most serious consequences. You should speak to the person or company you owe money to, to see if there are any manageable steps you can take to start reducing your debt.

Once you've got these debts under control, you should look at any other debts like credit card or store card debts, payday loans or missed Buy Now Pay Later payments. While you're looking at the money going out, do remember to consider money that could be coming in. It's always worth checking if there are any benefits that you're eligible for, including support with your energy costs and living costs.

There's a benefits calculator, advice on how to reduce living costs and information on other ways to increase your income on the National Citizens Advice website at citizensadvice.org.uk

There's also emergency support that you may be able to access locally, such as a food bank, local welfare support or fuel vouchers. We know that times are incredibly tough but please remember, you don't have to face this alone.

Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk can provide advice on this issue and much more, including debt, finances, employment, benefits and family/relationships. An account by Colin Wheeler



Ours was what you would call a 'quirky' cottage. Small, two bedrooms, creaky stairs and every

room the wrong shape and in just the wrong place. Like the proverbial Marmite — either love it or loathe it, but you can't ignore it! No front garden - the door opened onto the street. The back garden was a postage stamp — walled on all sides, paved, with raised borders doing little more than pay lip service to the idea of gardening. But it had one great feature. It was a real sun trap, and Annie had kept the old wooden garden bench she'd bought along with the house.

You could sit on that bench, drinking in the sun and the soft breeze, and let your imagination run riot. The big wooden workshop in the corner of the yard didn't detract from the peace and detachment this place offered. Ivy covered a lot of the garden wall, thick in places, and even thicker where it was wedded to the huge, lively, winter flowering jasmine - the only other thing, apart from the confounded wind flowers, that thrived in this tiny ecosystem. Imagine my surprise, then, while sitting out there contemplating nothing in particular, when I heard and felt, rather than saw, an object land noisily right beside me on the seat. Out of the blue! One minute I was alone, the next I was staring at a small, feathery bundle, whose eyes reflected terror,

that was staring right back at me.

Naively, I expected the thing to squawk or scream or something, then fly off in anger. Though why it might be angry, I had no idea. It had invaded my space, not the other way round. Anyway, momentarily we both just stared, but as the time wore on, I noticed that it wasn't anger I saw in its eyes, but pain and panic. And as I looked, I noticed that its feathers were torn. One wing looked to be only half tucked in and at a bit of an odd angle. Only then did I begin to think that this bird had not so much flown in, as dropped in, to my domain.

Now, I'm not a wildlife 'buff', and no expert, but I recognised my unwilling companion as a male blackbird, and I felt pity for its unfortunate state. There were traces of blood on its plumage and obviously the poor thing, badly mauled, had been in a scrap. I didn't realise how serious its injuries were until it tried to stand – and failed, because fully half of one leg was missing, and a drop of blood eased from the stump! No wonder it was frightened – exhausted, and in great pain, it had managed to flee the battle, only to land next to a scary, homicidal giant!

As it sat there in its misery, fatalistically accepting the certainty of its own death, my heart went out to it. Rising slowly from the seat, I went in through the back door, calling to Annie as I went. She came and stood by my side, both looking out at the pathetic sight. Without further ado, she grabbed a small, shallow dish and the bag of wild bird food which, fortuitously, we'd begun scattering regularly for the gang of sparrows that had hijacked our back yard. Another dish provided some water and she slowly took both out into the yard towards the bench. We both expected him to object, fly off or whatever, but he just stared suspiciously at this new giant that was approaching.

Truthfully, at that time, it was probably all he could do.


