## Residents' Viewpoint

## Vandalism at Blacksmiths Green!!

In reply ..

"Contrary to your writers view that the mistletoe was doing no harm, in fact the truth is quite the opposite. Mistletoe is a parasitic plant that lives off nutrients and water from its host tree significantly harming it over time. In the case of an apple tree, the fruit becomes small and damaged and the tree becomes weak and more likely to blow over in a high wind.



I know of three apple trees at Blacksmith Green, one in the grounds of the chicken farm, which was previously the orchard for Meadow Farm, and two opposite Meadow Farm set back from the road with a wide grass verge. If this land is privately owned, the owner may want to protect the apple tree which fruits well in the autumn.

If mistletoe is just cut back to the tree, being a parasite it may well grow back. To be sure that this won't happen the branch of the tree will have to be cut off below the base of the mistletoe.

This is what could have happened especially as is it is pruning time, and was not just a case of vandalism.

Of course mistletoe is a valuable source of food for wildlife especially the white berries in winter time. However, if it's an apple tree you could argue the fact that the fruit, whether on the tree or rotting on the ground, is also a valuable source of food for wildlife.

Either way, making sure the tree stays healthy does seem an important factor. There are after all quite a lot of trees in the area that are not fruit trees that host mistletoe."

The week before last I had a pretty hair-raising encounter with a passing van. As I stumbled out of the van's path, my trainer disappearing into a mud-filled pit while other parts of me became intimate with a pocket of blackthorn, what struck me most - after the ire had passed - was how often I don't end up in this situation, how many people in our village don't drive like that driver. More often that not when a car sees me at the side of the road walking, cycling or being dragged along by my crazy dog the driver will slow down, give me plenty of space, sometimes even a friendly wave back.

We can all have lapses in concentration. As a driver myself, the incident was a timely reminder of just how frightening it can be when a vehicle passes you at close speed. It also increased my resolve to wear bright or luminescent clothing whenever I am out walking or cycling (I don't always remember to do this and, as a driver, I appreciate how much easier it makes it to see more vulnerable road users).

I suspect there will always be the odd person happy to drive along without heed to village speed limits, let alone Highway Code requirements to drive carefully and slowly when approaching pedestrians on narrow rural roads. I'm not writing this for that driver (I am not really sure how you get that person to change how they drive). I am writing this to say thank you to all those drivers in our parish who do drive with consideration for other more vulnerable road users. Thank you. It is a pleasure to share the roads with you.

## Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on meeting held 2 March 2020

<u>Coronavirus</u> – the Parish Council will do all it can to help any resident unable to leave their home during this difficult time. Councillors contact telephone numbers and email addresses are listed in the magazine – please do not hesitate to get in touch if you are in need of help.

<u>Village Hall</u> – some refurbishment work will be taking place over the next few months pending a decision regarding a new hall. Refurbishment will include inside redecoration, overhaul of the wooden floor and improvements to lighting as well as some other minor repairs. The Parish Council is grateful to a number of volunteers who have come forward to help with the work.

Neighbourhood Plan — members were pleased to hear that a neighbourhood plan was progressing. With the aid of grant funding consultants will be appointed to help the group through the process and permission would need to be granted by Mid Suffolk District Council for the designated area of the plan — it was proposed this was the parish boundary as delineated on the ordnance survey map. Members thanked the Working Group for their report and the work they were doing on behalf of the parish.

<u>A140 Diversions</u> — County Cllr Stringer reported should there be a need for any diversions due to closure of the A140 these would be southbound through Mickfield and northbound through Mendlesham Green.

<u>Road signs</u> – it was reported that a number of damaged highway roadsigns had not been replaced, particularly along the A140. The meeting was reminded that any highway issues involving damaged or missing roadsigns, pot holes, overhanging vegetation or obscured road signs could be reported to Suffolk CC Highways by parishioners via the website reporting tool as follows:





#### STRANGE TIMES...

These are difficult times for all of us.

"Flu" has always been one of those illnesses that we take for granted, but which has always been quite dangerous, especially to those with pre-existing chest and heart complaints. To put current events into context, the World Health Organization estimates that "normal" flu kills up to 650,000 people worldwide each year. And the influenza pandemic of 1918-1919 killed more people than World War I.

It's easy to be despondent and think how bad things are – but... in reality, we've never been in better shape to deal with the health implications of the current outbreak. We live in a much better world than 100 years ago, we know a lot more about how to look after people with illness, and (in Europe at least) healthcare no longer depends on how much money you have.

As usual, Rotarians across the world will be doing what they can to help those who suffer the most, not only to deal with illness, but to provide even more basic needs – such as safe drinking water and sanitation.

#### A VISIT TO INDIA

Over the last 10 years or more, several Rotary clubs in this area have donated funds to a local charity, the Friends of the Banyan Tree (FoBT) which supports the work of charities improving the lives of indigenous (tribal) peoples in India. Recently, one of our members visited India and re-established links with a previously supported project.



The RCHS connection with FoBT goes back to 2013, when the club raised substantial funds for the charity with the help of our European partner clubs. The money raised helped pay for the building of a new community centre in Idinjar, Kerala, to be used for educational and social purposes Last year the club also donated money to help with flood relief. Other clubs in Suffolk have also made substantial contributions over the years, notably Woodbridge Rotary Club who recently paid for new hand washing, kitchen and internal fittings.

In February, Rotarian Chris and his wife Anita were on holiday in India and took the opportunity to re-visit Idinjar. They were able to observe (and join!) classes for local children in subjects from English to Physics, as well as seeing a visiting doctor providing

treatment for local people in the centre. Chris and Anita also donated an LED digital projector which will find a good deal of educational use by the charity (the charity will need to provide a screen and stand for use with the projector – if any individual or group like to help towards the cost of these, please contact the club).

## Survey of Wetheringsett's Orchards

### Canyouhelp?

- Do you have an old or chard or any veteran fruit trees?
- Have youplanted a new or chard?
- Would you be able to help complete a survey to identify existing orchards in Wethering sett?

Orchards East is an environmental and cultural project to survey and record orchard sites across the East of England. The project will support research into the environmental and economic benefits of historic orchards, as well as help to create new ones for the enjoyment of local communities.

A group of volunteers will be surveying and recording existing orchards in Wetheringsett to help support the project. For the purposes of the survey, an orchard is defined as 'five or more trees no more than 20m apart from crown edge to crown edge' – but we would also love to hear from anyone who has any old fruit trees in their garden, as these might have been part of an orchard in the past. Traditional orchards include apple, pear, cherry, plum, damson and cobnut trees.

The group will be meeting on the evening of <u>Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> April</u> to go through how to complete the surveys and arrange to try and view the 50 sites in the village identified by Orchard East (as well as see if there are any others not yet known to the project).







## Snippets from the Village History Parish Council Minutes: 1894 - 1954

Parish Council meetings were mainly held in the School Room in the evening, and on occasions were also held in the Mission Room in Wetherup and in the Rectory.

Here are some further excerpts:

#### June 1948

The Rector outlined suggested arrangements for the War Memorial Service. The British Legion to be asked to take the parade and be responsible for mustering. The proceedings to commence at the War Memorial with dedicatory Prayers followed by the unveiling by Sqn Leader Thurston. The Rector reported that roadworks connected with the Memorial were in hand and that the curbing stone was being installed at an approximate cost of £15.

#### August 1952

The correspondence relating to the proposed closure of Wetheringsett Churchyard was submitted, but owing to the absence of the Rector, the matter was adjourned.

So - what happened?

Mr Palfrey enquired whether the telephone at present in Brockford Station building could be made available to the general public.

So now the question, was the telephone in Brockford Station building ever made available to the general public? - does anyone know?

#### March 1954

The Clerk was instructed to draw the attention of the Highways Committee to the state of the 3 level crossings in the parish and to press that they be put in a good state of repair as soon as possible.

One last entry from the Parish Council for next month's newsletter and then we shall move on to other extracts from the Village History
