



Christmas Ghost Story

Why do people tell ghost stories at Christmas? This has become a tradition and as Dickens wrote, the ghosts of Christmas are really the past, present and future, swirling around us in the dead of the year. They're a reminder that we're all haunted, all the time, by good ghosts and bad, and that they all have something to tell us.

This year, in the newsletter, we re-

tell* a local ghost story

The pretty Suffolk village of Rattlesden is where the River Orwell springs from Orwell Meadow. Half-timbered houses watch over the charmingly named River Rat while 60 angels watch over the congregation of St Nicholas Church. But there were no angels watching over the former Rattlesden Rectory in the 1860s when a handyman was called in to repair parts of the crumbling red brick house which overlooked the river in the village and was working on some wooden panelling which had rotted and behind which rats lived. The following account is partly in his own words —

"As I worked away at the panelling, I noticed a sour, musty smell. It was only the ghost of an odour, but it made me feel a shade depressed," he said, "rats suggested themselves to me as an explanation of that smell, for I was told the old woodwork was full of rats."

Ignoring the smell, the man began work, unnerved by the fact he felt as if he was being watched. From the pantry, he heard a rustling, shaking noise before two hands appeared over the top of the door where he had hung a dust sheet to stop sawdust spoiling food.

"A moment later there was a whistle, low and eerie; the door opened wide and I got a horrible shock as there came out my white dust sheet with a head lolling on top of it. For some seconds, it remained silent and motionless, just outside the pantry door. Then it whistled again, the same low whistle."

Assuming that a prank was taking place, the man decided to scare away the joker by brandishing a hammer, but felt the figure rush past him towards the stairs.

"As it made this rush, it dropped the sheet and I was horrified to see that it was naked - a thing with pale, blotchy skin of the colour of old parchment," the account continued, "for a few moments, I watched this apparition in a state of benumbed perplexity, and as I watched it, my brain seemed to begin to grow muzzy.

"I felt some force was passing from the thing in the comer to me: it seemed to be some foul influence which was thrusting itself upon my brain and sapping all the powers of my mind and body. I felt that my consciousness was gradually being smothered by a thick, black mist. As I stood there half-dazed, the thing began to move again in a crouching posture."

"I have said it was naked and shaped like a man, but I could not see its face distinctly - only a kind of phosphorescent glow. I wondered if the thing had eyes - I could not see them. Anyway, it appeared to be blind, for it came towards me with arms outstretched, just as a man would advance if he were feeling his way in the darkness.

"I had a sickening, overwhelming feeling of evil and was conscious once again of that sour, musty smell. It was an intense smell now and I was somehow certain that it was the smell of death."

The awful encounter was far from over: the figure suddenly grabbed the



man, pressing its face close to his - the man described the skin of the creature as being similar to a pig's wizened bladder and noted that protruding from its mouth was a dried-up blue-tinged tongue.

After a struggle, the man was

After a struggle, the man was overcome by the stench and passed out. When he came to, the creature was gone

......but the smell remained. He later found out the ghost had been seen before, in the same place - a vicar had arranged for the pantry door to be nailed up, dogs had refused to stay in the house and

servants reported feeling as if the door was pushing against them.

Crime in Wetheringsett in 19



As reported in the local newspapers of the time

Robert Smith, Wetheringsett, labourer, was charged with having brutally assaulted Samuel Smith of Wetheringsett, his brother, on the 11th April last. - Defendant pleaded guilty. Samuel Smith said: My sister and her husband came to me on Good Friday and met and my father at Wetheringsett White Horse. Defendant was there and wanted me to stand a pot of beer. I refused and left. Defendant came after and knocked me and my father down upon the road and followed me to my house. He became very violent and knocked me about the head; he also opened a knife and said he would kill me. The whole affair lasted more than half an hour. My father was knocked into a ditch and had his arm broken in two places. I got him out and took him home. Defendant then came to my house and ill used me and my father, cutting my head in several places. -Mr Brooke rose from the Bench and stated that defendant was a bad character and had cruelly used his father and brother; that the face of the latter was quite black from bruises; that he frequently left his wife and children to starve; that he was drank three nights in a week, and was a disgrace to the parish. His father was afraid to prosecute because of the threatening language used towards him. - The Bench sentenced the fellow to one month's hard labour. -Thos. Smith, also a member of this family, was charged with using threatening language towards Samuel Smith, at Wetheringsett, Sunday night - John Smith, who presented a most pitiable appearance, one arm being in a sling, said: Thomas and Samuel are both my sons. Yesterday the defendant, who lives with me, said, Father, Sam is going to the sitting tomorrow; if he do he shall not come out alive; I will kill him. I said, "Oh dear Oh Dear, and begged him not to say so. He only came home from being a soldier last Michaelmas. I went to neighbour, and said "Get a policeman, I said "perhaps I had better, for I may thus save two lives, and I waited till the policeman came. - The Bench ordered defendant to find two sureties of £6 each and himself in 10/- to keep the peace three months; in default three month's imprisonment.

Snippets from the Village History Parish Council Minutes: 1894 - 1954

Parish Council meetings were mainly held in the School Room in the evening, and on occasions were also held in the Mission Room in Wetherup and in the Rectory.

Here are some further excerpts:

November 1937

A letter was read in reference to Overhead Electricity Mains through the village, and asking if the Parish Council have any observations to offer upon the proposal the Council are in favour of the proposal, and would press for a further extension, which would benefit the whole village.

February 1938

The meeting was held to draw up a plan for Air Defence in Wetheringsett. A good many names were brought forward, and it was proposed to see these people and enquire if they were willing to serve.

May 1939

Arrangements have been made with the Stowmarket Urban District Council for the services of the Fire Brigade belonging to the authority to be available for fire extinguishment in Wetheringsett-cum-Brockford. The Brigade can be summoned through Stowmarket Police—Telephone no. Stowmarket 14

July 1939

The meeting discussed water services for Fire Protection and selected the following ponds: a pond in front of the Trowel and Hammer, owner Mr Jefferis, Wetherup Street: a pond at White Horse Corner where the old pump draw water from A pond in the hockey meadow close by the nine new Council Houses ... a pond called the sand pit pond near Dale Farm... all the ponds require a good clean out.

O Star of Wonder, star of light is the chorus from the well-known carol, 'We Three Kings of Orient Are', which comes in at number 18 in Classic FM's Top 30 list of Christmas Carols.

Christmas carols feature a lot in our Christmas celebrations this year. In addition to the usual carol services in each of our churches (details can be found elsewhere in the magazine), favourite Christmas Carols and Songs is the theme of Wetheringsett's Christmas Tree Festival on Saturday 14th December, and the Waveney Choir Concert at Thorndon on 11th December at 7.30pm.

'We Three Kings' is the theme of this year's Follow the Star initiative by the Church of England, with 12 brand-new reflections for the Christmas period.

Follow the Star invites you to experience the wonder and excitement of the Wise Men's journey as they travel towards Jesus. 'We Three Kings' is an incredibly well-known carol written from the perspective of the wise men (or Magi) as they follow the star to discover Jesus. This year's reflections invite us to go on a similar journey of wonder and discovery, using daily themes suggested by the words of the carol's chorus: O star of wonder, star of night, star with royal beauty bright, westward leading, still proceeding, guide us to thy perfect light. John Henry Hopkins (1820–1891). As well as the reflections, each day offers a practical challenge to bring the theme alive together with a short prayer. There is always a slightly longer suggested Bible passage to read if you want to go a bit deeper. When Epiphany arrives and the wise men finally reach their destination, maybe you will have made some discoveries of your own about your journey of faith and the gifts you bring along the way.

The free Follow The Star app – available for Android and iOS devices – allows anyone to join the journey. The app includes full audio for each day, including the Bible reading and the daily craft activities. You can also sign up for free e-mail versions of the reflections via www.churchofengland.org/followthesta

Join us this Christmas as together we Follow the Star:

God of wonder, as we follow the star, open our minds to search for you, open our eyes to see you, and open our hearts to receive your love, this Christmas and always. Amen.

Subsequent enquiries established that the ghost was in all probability that of a parson who had once lived in Rattlesden, Robert Bumpstead and - for a reasons unknown, although there is speculation that it was to avoid body snatchers - he was buried under the pantry floor rather than in the churchyard.

Apparently disturbed in 1892, when the rectory was demolished, his skeleton was buried at the church and he began to be seen there, to the point where the local clergy staged an exorcism which finally gave Robert the peace he needed to move on. A relief to Rattlesden indeed.







Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council report on meeting held 4 November 2019

Cycle Route – Members were pleased to report very good attendance at the opening on the Cycle Route by County Cllr Andrew Stringer on Sunday 3 November. Sarah Payne was congratulated on the success of the opening and Members recorded thanks to her for all her work in bringing the project to fruition. It is hoped the cycle route will become a focal point of interest for residents and visitors alike. Thanks were also recorded to County Cllr Andrew Stringer for his grant contribution of £5,000, to the previous District Cllr Glen Horn for his contribution of £2,000 and to the Hakluyt Society for its contribution of £500.

Remembrance Sunday – three poppy wreaths were purchased by the Parish Council for Remembrance Sunday services, one for the 34th USAAF Bomb Memorial Service at Mendlesham represented by Cllr Mrs Ann Arnold, one for All Saints Church and one for the War Memorial at Hockey Hill represented by the Chairman of the Council, Cllr Charles Harvey.

Parish Precept 2020/21 — members considered a proposed parish council budget prepared by Cllr Mike Pease. This covered anticipated expenses over the next year 2020/21. With the exception of the Village Hall, it was anticipated that expenses would remain more or less at the same level. It was therefore agreed that the precept on the District Council remain at the same level as last year, £8850. Should there be any unexpected nominal expenses it was agreed these could be covered from existing reserves.

<u>Village Hall</u> – the future of the Village Hall has been an item for discussion at each parish council meeting over the last 18 months or so. Parish Councillors are faced with the decision whether to refurbishment the existing hall or to build a complete new hall, together with the cost and the availability or not of grant funding. Your parish councillors would now like to hear to view of residents on the options available and cordially invite parishioners to discuss these over Cheese and Wine on Friday 10 January, 7.30pm at the Village Hall. **Please do attend, your views on the future of the Hall and its use are very important.**

<u>Trees</u> – The supply of young trees for distribution in the village should be available from mid-December. Please contact Cllr Mrs Elizabeth Aldred if you have reserved a supply.


