On 10th January all residents were invited to attend a Cheese & Wine evening at the village hall to discuss options for its future. The Neighbourhood Plan and recent village survey were also discussed.

There was excellent input from Alan Wilkinson (KLH Architects), who outlined three main options for building work on the hall. It was stressed that these were not final plans from which to chose, but provided informed detailed frameworks so that a decision could be made on the way forward. The fourth option was for the village to relinquish responsibility for the hall, passing it back to the diocese. Near the conclusion of the evening a vote was taken. A report of the meeting with results of the vote is on the page opposite.


If we want an improved facility in the future we need to make full use of the hall now—in order to justify applications for any grants towards building costs


Village Hall Meeting - 10th January 2020

It seems that as soon as Christmas Day is over the shops and supermarkets are gearing up for the next round of celebrations!

It is now possible to buy Cadbury's cream eggs on Boxing Day, and it won't be long before red roses, heart shaped chocolates and Valentines cards will be filling the shelves in readiness for Valentine's Day.

These are quickly replaced by flour, eggs, lemons and pancake syrup to remind us that Pancake Day (Shrove Tuesday) will soon be upon us.

In March there will be a profusion of flowers, cards and gifts for Mother's Day, also known as Mothering Sunday. Then it's hot cross buns and Easter eggsl

I am always struck by how closely these important and familiar celebrations are linked to the church seasons, festivals and Saints days, and the common theme that runs through all of them is love.

St Valentine was a priest who was martyred in Rome in the third century. He is the saint we usually associate with love, representing God - who blesses those who love one another, and Jesus - who invites us to "love one another as I have loved you."

'God so loved the world that he gave his only son', and Mothering Sunday celebrates the angel announcing to Mary that she would be the mother of Jesus. It is a day when the church honours all those who show compassion and nurture of others.

The pancakes we make on Shrove Tuesday take us through the story of Lent and Easter when we recall the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, and his journey to the cross. It also points us to the amazing celebration of his resurrection on that first Easter morning. In our churches we celebrate with Easter egg hunts and craft activities, we light candles, let off party poppers, and even break open the bubbly!

These special days that make up the cycle of the seasons are part of an ongoing story of God's love for us. Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council Report on meeting held 6 January 2020

<u>Police report</u> — members noted the monthly online police report and noted there had been two recent local burglaries. Residents were encouraged to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity in the area to the local police via the 101 telephone number or in an emergency 999.

<u>Trees</u> – Cllr Mrs Aldred was pleased to report the allocated supply of young trees via the Suffolk Tree Warden Scheme had been received and the majority distributed. There would be a further supply next autumn but it was understood that would be the last year they would be available for the time being.

Taylor Wimpey planning application for 295 homes — Debenham — copy of a leaflet circulated to Debenham residents plus a covering email had been received by some Wetherup Street residents. The email asked that Wetheringsett Parish Council supported the objections to the proposed outline application. Whilst concerns were raised over the possible impact of increased traffic from the development travelling through Wetheringsett and Wetherup Street, members did not feel able to comment at this stage — there being no name to the leaflet or email. The item was also not an agenda item.

<u>Spring Litter Pick</u> – notification had been received from MSDC Waste Services inviting parishes to become involved in the Mid Suffolk Annual Litter Pick – this would be taking place between 20 March -13 April. Details would be forwarded to the Wetheringsett litter pick co-ordinator and a date for the community litter pick published when known.

Footpaths/Public Rights of Way – just a reminder to parishioners that any issues relating to footpaths, such as overgrown hedges/weeds/brambles obstructing a right of way or missing signs etc, can be reported direct to the County Council via its website reporting tool. This can be found at Suffolk.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/public-rights-of-way then go to Report a public rights of way issue. Similarly potholes or any highway issues can be reported at the same site but go to Report a highway issue. The fault will need to be marked on the map provided on the website and the address also provided but it is a very simple and easy process to follow.

A Brief History of the Village Hall

This Text is taken from the Second Edition of the Village History, Chapter 19, Management and Amenities; P144-147 - edited.

- In 1920 £60 was raised and a WW1 Army Drill Hall was purchased from Ipswich; moved and opened on 28 March 1921. Within a year an extension was planned and the roof tinned over the felt.
- 1926 Men's toilets were added. It is not known when ladies were afforded such privilege!
- By 1930 the Hall was used a lot and the caretaker's remuneration was increased to 7/6 a week.
- 1937 Heating was always a problem and two fireplaces and chimneys were built. These have gone, although the bases are still there.
- 1939 The Hall was used by the Army which was based at the Manor, except on Wednesdays when the Home Guard used it. (I query this as my Father was a Captain in Dad's Army and he said they met out side the King's Head in Mendlesham at 5.50pm and went inside at 6pm; except the man on duty at the top of the church tower who had to look out for the German invasion!)
- 1947 Major repairs to the roof; the asbestos one with which we are now blessed.
- 1951 The ladies' toilet needed improvement; by 1959 the bucket was replaced by a flush toilet and in 1969 a handbasin added.
 1982 approx. the weatherboard was netted over and plastered
- 1982 approx., the weatherboard was netted over and plastered, and the toilet block added.
- Although the Hall is run by its own committee, it is under the control of the Parish Council which has to fund its never ending repairs.

 Older Councillors will confirm that for 30 years we have been saying:

It will do one more year. One year it won't.





Recording the Natural History of Suffolk

The 2020 Suffolk

Naturalists' Conference:

'On the verge of success'

Saturday 29th February 2020 at Wherstead Park, Ipswich A national conference with the aim of sharing best practice on the management of roadside verges.

There is increasing interest in these fragments of semi-natural grassland and their potential role as corridors for ecological networking. This will be an opportunity to find out more about some of the pioneering work happening in counties like Lincolnshire and Dorset. in adopting new technologies and county-wide' wildlife verge management practices, which both benefit wildlife and save money.

Snippets from the Village History Parish Council Minutes: 1894 - 1954

Parish Council meetings were mainly held in the School Room in the evening, and on occasions were also held in the Mission Room in Wetherup and in the Rectory. Here are some further excerpts:

August 1941

A special meeting ... the Parish Council decided to appoint themselves as the Invasion Committee with the addition of the following names:

Mr Fred Lacey A.R.P. Representative

Mrs Hurrell First Aid

The Rector H.G. (Home Guard) Representative

Mr Stoke Vaughan with powers to co-op if necessary

February 1945

... Hartismere R.D.C. proposing in the Post War period Plans to provide the village with a piped water supply with the source of supply at Pitmans Corner ... urged the R.D.C. not to proceed with a stand pipe scheme but to connect to houses direct.

The Clerk reported that in the 4 Post War years, Hartismere R.D.C. proposed to erect 18 houses in the parish of Wetheringsett and that

the land required amounted to 3 acres.

March 1946

... a letter of thanks from the Commanding Officer of USAAF Station 156 to the Town Council of Brockford for hospitality shown to officers and men of Station 156 at Mendlesham.*

... the number of houses to be built in the 1st Post War period was 6, and that developments in the provision of water were temporarily held up over the question of the site of the main supply, but there were good prospects of the scheme materialising by 1951.
