The play features two of Suffolk's most famous residents — George Orwell, who took his name from the River Orwell, and Arthur Ransome, who was resident on it. The play poses the question - what would have happened if these two people had met? It starts in Southwold Harbour just before the outbreak of war



when Orwell's father was dying and Ransome, with his wife Evgenia, were sailing out of Pin Mill. In 1944 Orwell is about to write 'Animal Farm' and is intrigued that Ransome is married to the former secretary of Russia's revolutionary leader, Trotsky. With Orwell's suspicion of spies and Ransome's inability to explain how they got out of Russia after the revolution, sparks could fly! The play follows their two stories over 20 years when all three are in search of answers, both political and personal.

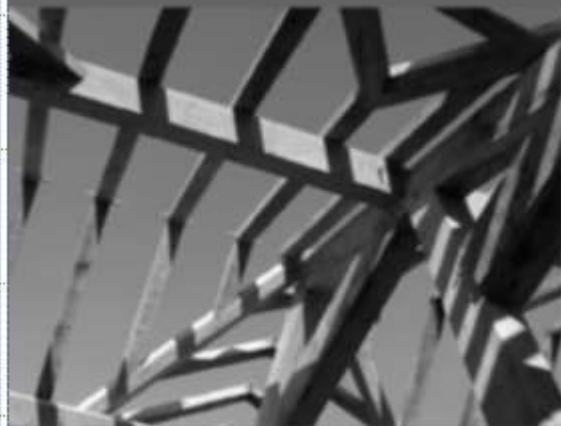

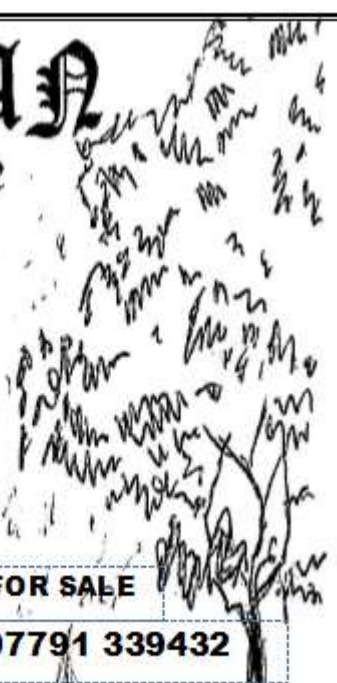



Journeying with Jesus

Last month we thought about some important celebrations such as Valentine's Day and Pancake Day (Shrove Tuesday). During March we celebrate St David's Day, St Patrick's Day and, also Mothering Sunday on 22nd March.

In the life of the church, this month also marks the season of Lent, when we journey with Jesus to the cross.

Last year I visited the Holy Land for the first time, and literally followed in the footsteps of Jesus as I visited important sites that told the story of his life, death and resurrection. I travelled 6248 air miles, trod 72,248 footsteps where Jesus walked, climbed to the highest point, Mt Tabor 575m and swam (or rather, floated!) in the lowest point - the Dead Sea. I worshipped at 27 churches and holy sites, exchanged lots of smiles and greetings with people of different countries, faiths and cultures, and cried more tears than I can count.

It was a wonderful experience, and it brought the bible stories vividly to life for me:

To be in his presence
To walk where he walked
To hear the distant echo of his voice
and speak his words of love

To breathe the air he breathed
To be under the same sky as him
To watch the same sunrise and sunset
and stand on the shore that lapped at his feet

To see his face in the faces of those we meet
To laugh as he laughed, weep as he wept
and hurt as he hurt

To walk with him the way of the cross

During Lent I will be sharing a PowerPoint presentation of my trip, and we'll engage with the 'Journeying with Jesus' study guide published by Embrace the Middle East. The sessions will be at **Thorndon Church** on **Tuesday 10th, 17th, 24th, and 31st March** from **7.30 to 9.00pm**. On the last evening we will share some Middle Eastern food together- no charge, but donations towards the Bishops Lent appeal will be gratefully received!

Mothing Sunday

Mothing Sunday began as an explicitly religious event of the 16th Century, with no connection to mothers at all. It became a tradition that, on the fourth Sunday of Lent, people would return to their mother church for a special service. This meant that families were reunited, as adults returned to the towns and villages where they grew up. In time, it became customary for young people who were working as servants in large houses, to be given a holiday on this day to return home. They could use this day to visit their own mother and often took a gift of food or hand-me-down clothing from their employers to her. Over time this became known as Mothing Sunday. The term has been usurped and is now known, more popularly, as Mother's Day.

Mother's Day

The American Mother's Day does not have religious connotations and was formally established as a public holiday (held every year on the 2nd Sunday of May), by President Wilson in 1914 after a campaign was launched by an American woman from West Virginia named Anna Jarvis, whose own mother died in May. Jarvis later held protests at the commercialisation of the day.

However, in the UK, Mothing Sunday is always celebrated on the fourth Sunday of Lent. It is exactly three weeks before Easter Sunday and usually falls in the second half of March or early April. This year it is on 22nd March

Wetheringsett cum Brockford Parish Council
Report on meeting held Monday 3 February 2020

Village Hall – parish council members appreciated the good attendance at the cheese and wine evening held on 10 January to discuss the future of the village hall. Of the options put forward there was overwhelming support for a newly built village hall.

This will require a number of parishioners joining together to take the project forward, a group of at least 7 would be ideal and our members would appreciate parishioners considering joining a group or contacting a parish councilor to obtain further information as to how the project can progress.

Planning application for 9 dwellings – land at Norwich Road, Wetheringsett – this application was considered for recommendation to Mid Suffolk District Planning Department. Parish Council members recommended approval on the grounds the site is inside the settlement boundary and included in the draft Mid Suffolk Local Plan, the site is close to services and public transport.

Two further applications were however recommended for refusal :

Land at Blacksmiths Green, Wetheringsett – application for change of use of agricultural land and erection of one dwelling and new vehicular access and **Green Farm, Pages Green** – notification for prior approval for proposed change of use of agricultural building to a dwelling house (C3) and Order 2015 Schedule 2, Part 3, Class Q – conversion of two agricultural buildings to create four dwellings. These were recommended for refusal on the grounds both sites were not identified in the Mid Suffolk draft Local Plan, ie they were in open countryside and not sustainable, the Blacksmiths Green site bordered a pond and was in the vicinity of listed buildings, the access road to the Green Farm site was too narrow to accommodate the proposed number of dwellings.

VE Day Friday 8 May – a village event to celebrate VE day was discussed. It was reported the Middy was planning to host an event. Members therefore suggested the parish council joined with the Middy or supported their event. Details to follow.

Snippets from the Village History

Parish Council Minutes: 1894 - 1954

Parish Council meetings were mainly held in the School Room in the evening, and on occasions were also held in the Mission Room in Wetherup and in the Rectory. Here are some further excerpts:

April 1946

The state of Joe's Road was discussed at length. Reference was made of the necessity in wintertime of school children and others using the railway line because of the mud. The Clerk instructed to explore the possibility of the County Council properly making up this road.

April 1947

It was unanimously decided to accept the offer of the Comforts Fund that cash balances in hand should be spent in having the names inscribed on the War Memorial the names of the Fallen of the Parish of World War II ... in the meantime the Rector to make careful, sympathetic investigation as to the relatives' personal feelings on this matter.

The Clerk was instructed to investigate the possibilities of a telephone kiosk being erected in Church Street, Wetheringsett, and Brockford Street.

Was there ever a telephone kiosk in Brockford—does anyone know?

February 1948

It was resolved to ask the Air Ministry to reopen to the general public Town Lane.

The Parish Council were informed that approximately £18.9.0 was available for expenditure on the War Memorial. The following names were considered eligible: Claude Chapman; Harold Cole; Peter Sheldrake; Ernest Barker (Civil Defence); Leslie Ling; John Nunn. Mr W Ling has signified his willingness to keep the Memorial and its surrounds tidy.
